<u>CERT</u>	Feb. 20 - The College Equipped Readiness Test (CERT) is an online assessment used to help students get ready for the ACT. CERT tests are age appropriate and address the content areas included in the ACT: English, Math, Reading and Science. The tests also match the format of the ACT including timing, question types, and difficulty levels. Students and parents can go online and see results of the test and be given detailed video instructions for each answer.
<u>Academic</u> <u>Awards</u>	May 16 - Students who have won scholarships, first honors, and state or national recognition, and their parents, are invited to attend this event held at NDA from 7:00-8:30pm . A reception follows the ceremony.
<u>Final</u> Exams	May 28-30 - Students will follow a special half-day schedule each of these days in order to have an exam in each of their classes.
<u>Cleaning Day</u>	May 31 - All Freshmen, Sophomores, and Juniors are required to come to NDA for one hour of cleaning. All students share in ownership of the school and are expected to care for it as well.

Police officers are also present. Students must arrive by 9:00 pm and may not leave before 10:45 pm. All-school dances are open to any high school student.
- Special
SchedulesSometimes there are adjusted schedules. The one most frequently used is
the "Delayed Schedule." We use this schedule every Wednesday when school
begins at 8:45 am. On these days, the faculty meets from 7:30 8:30 am,
and students begin school at 8:45 am. Students may be required to report to
school before 8:45 on some Wednesdays for a class meeting, club gathering or
other important meeting. The "Delayed Schedule" may also be used for snow
delays.

- **Service** Freshmen will have their Service Requirements explained in their Religion class.
- **Scheduling** The scheduling process for the following year begins in January. Freshmen and their parents will be invited to attend an information meeting, and all students will meet during a long homeroom period to discuss course options. The various departments recommend students for the level (college prep, honors, AP) of a required course and students select their electives.
