## JUNIOR CLASS INFORMATION 2018-19

<u>College</u> Sept. 11 – This presentation will begin at 6:30pm and is designed for Juniors and <u>Financial Aid</u> Seniors and their parents. <u>Presentation</u>

- **Picture Day** Oct. 5 - Students may be out of uniform for their school picture. However they may not wear a V-neck or any low cut top, or one that has writing on it. Shorts or skirts must be an appropriate length. Students will bring home a flier prior to Oct. 5th and payment for pictures is expected on Picture Day. Students will still need to have picture taken if not buying a packet to get school id.

## OTHER EVENTS

**NHS** Juniors who qualify for National Honor Society based on scholarship will be mailed an invitation in the fall to apply for membership. A faculty committee will review all applications that meet the deadline date to determine if students have met the additional NHS qualifications of service, leadership, and character. Those students who are accepted will be notified and invited to an Induction Ceremony.

- <u>College Days</u> Five college visit days combined during Junior and Senior years are permitted and will not count as missed days. Please refer to the handbook for complete information regarding college visit days. To be excused absences, these days must be taken before April 30, and the proper form signed and dated by University/College personnel.
- **Scheduling** The scheduling process for the following year begins in January. Juniors and their parents will be invited to attend an information meeting, and all students will meet during a long homeroom period to discuss course options. The various departments recommend students for the level (college prep, honors, AP), of a required course, and students select their electives.
- <u>Service</u> Junior year is a very special year of service because students will do their service during the school day. In the spring they will spend approximately two hours on Tuesday or Thursday mornings in a school, daycare, nursing home, shelter or other agency in need of volunteer help. The students will have a great deal of input in determining their service placement.
