NDA SENIOR WINS SCHOLARHIP TO STUDY AND WORK IN BRAZIL

NDA's Brooke Barker was recently awarded the Toyota TEMA Community Scholarship to spend 6 weeks studying abroad. Below Brooke explains a bit more about her plans for the summer in Brazil and her experience in pursuing this opportunity.

The Toyota TEMA Community scholarship is a full merit-based scholarship to spend six weeks in either Japan, Brazil, or Germany through Youth For Understanding (YFU) USA. It covers the cost of the program (\$11,295) and

round-trip travel. Last summer, I had the opportunity to spend a couple weeks in Spain while living with a family and taking classes at a local university, and it was the experience of a lifetime. This year, I wanted to continue to travel and learn about other cultures, so I searched online and came across the YFU program and Toyota scholarship. Mr. Martin also promoted the scholarships and opportunities provided by Toyota. Subsequently, I applied online in early January by writing multiple essays, sending transcripts and letters of recommendation, and interviewing with a local representative. I was recently awarded the scholarship, and I am still in disbelief! In Brazil, I will live with a family and basically follow their daily schedule while immersing myself in the culture. I have no prior schooling in the Portuguese language, but I chose Brazil because I have learned a lot about South America during my four years of Spanish classes at NDA. I hope to engage in local festivals, explore the Amazon, volunteer in the community, and take on whatever else comes my way. Needless to say, I am so grateful for this opportunity, and I am excited beyond words to follow my passions through traveling this summer!

MAGNIFIED GIVING <

The Magnified Giving Program, founded by Mr. Roger Grein, empowers NDA's seniors to become junior philanthropists. The students research many local non-profit agencies and then choose their top two to receive a donation. The program is funded by generous donations from numerous benefactors. The program allows students to make decisions and develop leadership skills, as well as giving them an opportunity to make a difference in the lives of others.

This year's Magnified Giving Program finalists were Faces Without Places and Potters Ranch. A spokesperson from each talked to the seniors before they made their final decision.
