## **REMINDERS FOR INCOMING FRESHMEN & TRANSFER STUDENTS**

- All incoming freshmen need to turn in their **immunization forms** by Friday, August 31.
- **FRESHMAN ORIENTATION** is an important part of the transition process for students. This year's Freshman Orientation will be held on **Monday, August 27, from 8:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. for incoming freshmen**. Lunch will be provided. The orientation program will include information about the daily schedule, course requirements, opportunities for co-curricular involvement and the use of the iPad. Your daughter will have the opportunity to meet current and new students and start to develop some important relationships. Students will meet in Alumnae Hall and need to bring their iPads to the Freshman Orientation. Students are not required to wear uniforms for orientation. Dress is casual.
- If you are the parent of an incoming freshman or a sophomore transferring to NDA, please plan to attend the **Parent Infor**mation Meeting on Tuesday, August 28 at 6:30 p.m. in the theater. If you are the parent of a junior or senior transferring to NDA, please plan to attend the **Parent Information Meeting** on **Wednesday, August 29** at 6:30 p.m. in the theater. At the parent meeting you will receive important information about the school year and how we will help your daughter in making the transition to NDA. Student schedules will be distributed at this meeting as well as information about accessing Power School (online grading and records) accounts.

# STUDENT LIFE UPDATE

## **Dress Code**

All students at Notre Dame Academy are required to wear a school uniform, which emphasizes a traditional dress code. This code is intended to: encourage cleanliness, neatness and pride in one's appearance; foster respect for the way in which one



presents herself to others; create a semi-formal atmosphere needed for a disciplined learning environment; provide a uniform manner of dressing which minimizes social differences that may exist among students.

In addition to the required uniform pieces, visible body piercings (except the ear) visible tattoos and unnatural hair coloring are prohibited at school. Failure to comply with these expectations will result in disciplinary measures.

This year, students will be permitted to carry either purses or backpacks from class to class. While specific measurements will not be provided, the purse or backpack must be able to fit under the student's desk. If this cannot occur, the backpack or purse will not be permitted as this causes safety issues in the classroom. A student will be expected to store items in her locker if her purse or backpack cannot fit under the desk.

## Parking Passes

Student parking passes will be sold prior to the start of the school year. Find the sales schedule below:

**Seniors** can purchase passes beginning Monday, August 27 at 2:00 p.m. The front office closes at 4:00 p.m. each day, and seniors leaving for retreat on this day should plan accordingly as **Juniors** can begin purchasing parking passes starting Wednesday, August 29 at 2:00 p.m. **Sophomores** are invited to purchase their parking passes starting Friday, August 31 any time between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Once the grade level purchasing window has opened, students in that grade can purchase at any time.

To purchase a parking pass, students must bring the completed form found <u>HERE</u> and \$25 cash or check made payable to Notre Dame Academy. If a student is unable to be on campus to make the purchase, only a family member will be permitted to do so in her absence. **Students can purchase a parking pass once they have acquired their intermediate (full) license.** 




## SUMMER READING ┥
