bid. If you don't have access to a Smart phone, DON'T WORRY! You can still bid on any item or make a donation via text messaging or through a Gesture Pro member at the event.

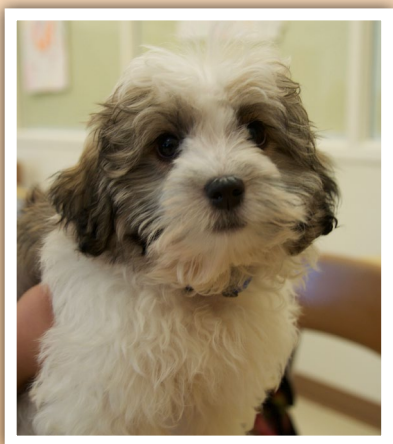
EARLY BIDDING FOR REGISTERED GUESTS!

TO REGISTER:

Starting today and right up to the night of the event, you can register your cell phone via a text prompt or computer at nda16gala.gesture.com. You will be asked to enter your name, cell phone number and email address. After a few moments, you will receive a text message from Gesture. Confirm your participation in the Gesture Mobile Bidding system by replying "Y" to this text. You will receive a welcome text message including a blue link to the auction site. Once you are registered, you can begin bidding!

At the event: If you have not registered your cell phone prior to the Auction, Gesture representatives will be on hand to assist you in registering your phone and will also be available throughout the evening for assistance, or to be your "personal shopper" to bid for you, should your phone be unavailable. *Free WiFi will be available at NDA and a Gesture representative will be on staff to assist you.

If you cannot attend the Autumn Gala but would like to support the event, you can either register with Gestures online and take part in the bidding OR purchase a **First Choice** ticket for \$50 from Sr. Paul Ann and Sr. Rachel. 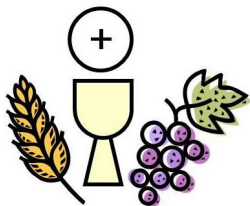


FOUR NDA STUDENTS NAMED NATIONAL MERIT COMMENDED STUDENTS ◀

Membership in NDA's Chapter of Drug Free Clubs of America has grown: a 28% increase from last year, with over half of our student body enrolled!!

2016 NDA FRUIT SALE

FRUIT SALE 2016 ◀

Friday, September 30th is the kick off for the fruit sale. Your daughter will be bringing home her packet of information and instructions. This year the order form that the girls will be using will be online. The customer can pay with check or cash either when they order the fruit or when it is delivered to them in December.

Fruit Sale Information

Selling Time: September 30th – October 21st

1. The fruit sale helps support the entire athletic program. Your daughter needs to sell at least 12 boxes. We hope that everyone does not stop at 12 boxes but continues to sell even more (the fruit is sold by the box). The fruit sale, golf outing, and Panda 250 are the support of the athletic program.

2. We sell fruit in 2/5 size boxes. The grapefruit, navels and tangelos are delivered direct from the groves and the apples direct from the Washington state orchards.

We will replace any bad fruit until December 8, even one bad piece! Bring in the bad fruit and it will be replaced.

These are approximate quantities in each box:

Red Grapefruit	\$26 (about 18-20 pieces)
Tangelos	\$26 (about 30-40 pieces)
Navels (seedless)	\$26 (about 20-30 pieces)
Red Delicious Apples	\$30 (40 pieces)
Gift/Mixed Box	\$31 (includes grapefruit (about 6), navels (about 8), & apples (about 12))

3. Fruit trucks will arrive at school December 2nd for unloading and packing the mixed boxes with pickup and delivery to customers 12/3 & 12/4. Exchanges and additional purchases will be made until 12/8. All money is due by 12/09.

4. Mrs. Schmidt has names of past customers if you have trouble selling the fruit. The girls can stop in the morning or at their lunch to get names. She is in the foyer every morning 7:30-8:00 to offer assistance.

5. We ask that all parents and students work at least a 2-hour shift the weekend the fruit arrives.

The fruit sale helps build community among the athletes and the Parents. All are working for a common goal. This is making the Notre Dame Pandas the best sport program in Northern Kentucky. GO PANDAS!!
