My mind has been trained to think outside of the box and answer questions for itself. As I embark on new adventures, I have the confidence to use the technology given to me to further my success.

Catholic Schools Week -- Communities of Faith, Knowledge and Service



Kelsey Sucher achieved the ultimate goal for anyone taking the ACT college entrance exam: a perfect composite score of 36! Kelsey, a junior at Notre Dame Academy, became one of the few elite students across the nation to accomplish this impressive feat after taking the test in December. Her accomplishment is significant and rare. On average, less than one-tenth of 1 percent of all test takers earns the top score. Congratulations Kelsey!



ELLEN KENDALL NAMED SEMIFINALIST

Congratulations to NDA senior Ellen Kendall who is one of two Kentucky semifinalists recognized recently in the 2015 Intel Science Talent Search. Annually, students entering the Intel STS compete for more than \$1.6 million in awards. Only 300 students are announced as semifinalists each year. From this select pool, 40 finalists are then invited to Washington, DC in March to participate in final judging, display their work to the public, meet with notable scientists, and compete for three top awards of \$150,000 each.



NDA ALUMNA GIVES STUDENTS A SNAPSHOT PHOTOJOURNALIST'S LIFE

Carrie Cochran, an alumna of Notre Dame Academy class of 1997, came to talk to the Photography Club, Monday, January 12. She is a video journalist working for the Cincinnati Enquirer. A biology major at the University of Cincinnati, Carrie changed her life around when she joined the college's newspaper staff. From then on, she has been taking both pictures and videos around the city. "My heart really goes into telling other people's stories – mostly regular people who don't get much media attention," she states on her website.

From her presentation, a few things stuck out. These days, to be in the photojournalist department, you need to be familiar with making and editing videos. Also, photojournalists tell a story through their pictures. You may need to take hundreds of photos until you get the one that tells the story the most. Ms. Cochran said that when she's out doing a story, she just pushes herself out of her comfort zone. "I'm more of a shy person," she says, "and being a photojournalist, you can't be shy."

Carrie Cochran has offered to help the photography club with a project that she could collatorate on with our members. Instead of taking photos based on a theme, we could create a documentary of something happening in our school. She would help us edit the documentary and give us tips on how to make it better.
