This summer, Notre Dame Academy is kicking off its **Panda Test Prep Program** with an ACT Prep Course. The course will be held Monday, June 4 through Friday, June 8 from 9:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m. each day. This ACT Prep Course is aligned with the June 9 and July 14 ACT test dates. The course will be taught by NDA faculty members and features:

- **Small Class Size** - Class will be limited to 20 students

MAKING A DIFFERENCE ◀

Earlier this year in Catholic Social Teaching we watched a video called Poverty Inc. and discussed the system for giving to charity that most people use and the benefits and downfalls of that system. As a part of the discussion we talked about micro-financing and the fact that helping an individual further their education or start/grow their own business makes a lasting impact on their lives, their community, and the economy of their country whereas our traditional forms of charity often address a person's immediate needs and give a handout instead of a "hand up." The class decided that they would like to get involved in micro-financing and give their own loan to a business in need. After doing some research we decided to work with an organization called Kiva to loan money to a person in need. The group decided to loan \$120 to Nyein, a woman in Myanmar, so she could hire laborers for her field. Not only did that money help her to feed her family and stock her shop, but it also gave jobs to other people in her community! Nyein has already paid back her loan in full and we will be choosing another project to loan our money to so that it can benefit

Photos from the winning school will be used in KHEAA publications and on KHEAA websites.

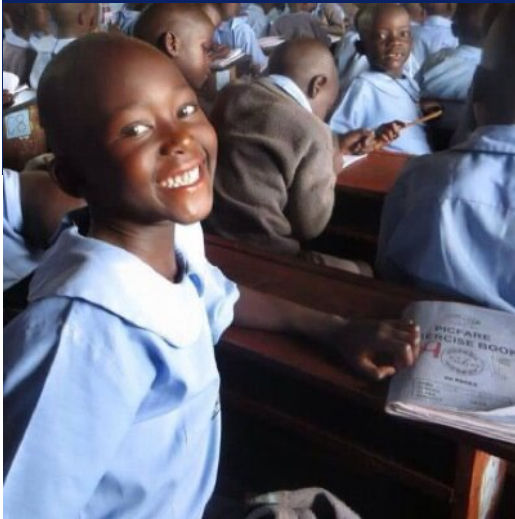
