
Our opening day was full of the sisterhood spirit as our Student Council sponsored a lively and energetic welcome for our new and returning students. We are excited to welcome 578 students, including 157 new students representing 28 different grade schools in our area.

During our first day, students met each of their teachers, inducted our new Student Council leaders and attended grade level meetings. We also came together as a community to reflect on the significance of our theme - *Celebrating Sisterhood*. The theme reminds us of our SND heritage, the legacy of Alumnae who are making a difference in our community and our many young women who learn together every day. We have much to be grateful for and our opening school mass was a great opportunity to celebrate and give thanks for God's love for us.

This Friday we will celebrate our common summer reading experience of *I Am Malala* by Malala Yousafzai. A committee of 35 faculty, staff and students worked hard this summer to plan this special day. In reading this book, we have all gotten to know

a young woman with a very strong ethic of service - who has embraced the cause of girls' education in a very personal way. Our hope is that Malala's story has inspired our readers to have a sense of empathy for young girls in other parts of the world and to empower them to speak up for everyone's right to a good education without fear of persecution and reprisal.

Because Malala's experience is in a part of the world that is experiencing a great deal of violence, persecution and turmoil (as her own story attests) some of the presentations will include some difficult images. As educators we believe it is important to expose our students to these issues in an honest way supported by the safe and constructive environment of our Catholic school. Most importantly our students will be made aware of the challenges many young women face around the world and have an opportunity to reflect on ways in which they might embrace these girls in a sisterhood of global proportion.
