NDA senior Gabby Hacker rows with the Cincinnati JR Rowing Club along with several other girls from NDA and this sport is taking her to levels she never imagined. In 2014, after rowing not even a year, Gabby competed in the varsity 4 seat boat and finished 5th in the nation.

In July of this year, her varsity 8 finished 2nd in the nation at the US Rowing Youth National Championships in New Jersey. In her boat were other NDA students, Mary Shannon Malloy and Emily Schutzmann. Two other students from Notre Dame, Ashley Wright and Ryan Cleves finished 3rd in the lightweight eight.

Gabby's current personal record for doing a 2K on the erg (indoor rowing machine) is 7:18 and is in the 99 percentile for her age. In February, she finished 2nd at the Cincinnati Indoor Rowing Invite. Gabby currently has two full ride scholarship offers from Indiana and Ohio State. She has recently taken official visits to Michigan and Clemson. On her trip to Michigan she was able to meet Amanda Elmore who won a gold medal in Rio in rowing in the women's eight. Gabby will be taking her official visits at Ohio State and Virginia in the next two weeks.
