# MAKING A DIFFERENCE WITH MICRO-FINANCING



In Catholic Social Teaching we have been talking about the concepts of solidarity and subsidiarity in conjunction with watching the documentary Poverty, Inc. Solidarity is the idea that we are connected to one another as a global community and that when one part suffers we all suffer. Subsidiarity tells us that it is beneficial to address issues at the lowest competent level of government possible. Poverty, Inc. gave us many examples of how when we give to charity through non-governmental organizations (NGOs) and government programs, oftentimes our money is not being as helpful as we think and is sometimes even perpetuating the problem. This caused us to look at other options of how we can make a difference in the lives of our brothers and sisters who are living in poverty. This is what led us to micro-financing. With the principle of subsidiarity in mind, we are able to fund loans for individuals who may not otherwise have

access to banking services to help them improve their personal lives, the areas that they live, and ultimately the economy of their country. We chose to work through an organization called Kiva. Two classes together were able to give out two loans valuing over \$300. Those loans will get repaid over time and we will then be able to loan that money out again. This is the 2nd year that we have done this project and we have loaned out over \$700 to 5 different people between money that we have brought in and loans that have been repaid already. This year we have chosen to fund loans for Abir and Fausto Francisco.



### IMPORTANT NEW ROLE

NDA Science teacher Mrs. Terri Perrino has been asked to serve as the community representative on Northern Kentucky University's Institutional Research Board (IRB). She will serve a 3-year term in this important role. All federally funded organizations where research is conducted are required to have an IRB. They review all research protocols that utilize human subjects. Mrs. Perrino is excited about this new position and looks forward to learning more about research in order to help her students at NDA.

### PREPARING FOR EXAMS

Many of our freshmen recently attended a Lunch and Learn on how to prepare for mid term exams presented by Mrs. Monohan and Ms. Ericson. They reviewed exam schedules, how to create study guides, different study apps, and when and how to begin preparing for exams.



You can tell your daughter is upset but doesn't want to talk about it...how come?

What can you do to improve communication?

- She may be worried you'll have a big or bad reaction
- She is concerned if she talks about it, there will be negative consequences
- She may be worried you will tell someone else
- She may already be talked out about the topic or feel things aren't going to be solved by talking
- Could ask if they're worried about your reaction and that's why she doesn't want to talk
- Attempt to remain compassionate and realize that teens make mistakes too




