Also during the luncheon, Mary Brown received the Sister Mary Reina Arlinghaus Award for exemplifying the mission of Notre Dame Academy through her dedication to serving her community.

Sister Mary Ethel Parrott, SND (2016 *Women Making A Difference* recipient) began the luncheon with a prayer and Sister Georgia Marie Messingschlager, CDP '56 (2009 *Women Making A Difference* recipient) gave opening remarks. NDA Offers Scholarships to Future Pandas

Notre Dame Academy offered \$58,750 in academic scholarships to 24 incoming freshmen for the fall of 2018 at NDA's

High School Placement Test Results Meeting. Representing eleven local grade schools, these talented students earned the scholarships based on their outstanding performance on the High School Placement Test (HSPT) in December 2017.

Due to the generosity of the Sisters of Notre Dame and other benefactors, Notre Dame Academy awards several academic scholarships to the top performers on the HSPT each year. The scholarships range from \$500-\$2500. This year, NDA offered 14 renewable Academic Excellence Scholarships to students who scored in the 99, 98, and 97 percentile, and 24 benefactor scholarships based on academic performance.



MAKING A **DIFFERENCE** IN MATH CLUB



Earlier this school year, the NDA Math Club was awarded a Dress Down Day Club Grant. The students of Math Club used this grant money to buy school supplies such as markers, pencils, erasers, math flash cards, and rulers as well as jump ropes and kick balls for the after school "Fit Kids" program at Newport Primary School. They have been doing service there since the beginning of this year with the kids in this program.

During their time at Newport Primary School, the students have helped the "Fit Kids" with math homework, math games on their iPads, and other math fact practices. After about 45 minutes of homework time, the kids then go to the gym for some fitness time.

In March, the Math Club delivered all of the goodies that they bought with the grant money and then helped with the students' workouts. One workout was creating a bar graph using data collected for how many times each person did an exercise. The students of Math Club are very grateful for this rewarding experience.

NDA Students Receive 115 **Scholastic Writing Awards**



The Notre Dame Academy English Department proudly announces that NDA's talented young writers recently received 18 Gold Keys, 52 Silver Keys, and 44 Honorable Mentions for a total of 115 writing awards in the Scholastic Art and Writing Competition.

Two Notre Dame Academy students, Kate Williams and Clara Dusing, were recognized as American Voices nominees. Each region has five American Voices nominees. One winner will be chosen from each region and presented the American Voices Medal at a ceremony in NYC.

All gold key winners moved on to the national competition where NDA had three students place nationally: Kate Williams - Gold medal and American Voices Award, Clara Dusing - Gold medal, Ellie O'Hara - Silver medal. The works of these students are of the top 1% of art and writing submitted to the 2018 Scholastic Awards.



NDA's Mock Trial Team had another spectacular year! After placing 1st at Regionals, the team came in an impressive 4th place in the Kentucky Mock Trial State Tournament in March at the Kenton County Justice Center. Under the sharp and knowledgeable guidance of NDA Alumnae Katelyn (Connor) Mollett '08 and Amy Hebbeler '09, the team catapulted to a 4th place finish in only its third year of existence.

Team members included seniors, Abby Bruns and Olivia Bosch, juniors Libby Smith, Julia Hughes, and Elly Piatt, sophomores Natalie Gerdes and Mara Schutt and freshman Dani Shoemake. With outstanding performances, Elly Piatt took home NDA's Best Witness Award, while Olivia Bosch and Julia Hughes took home the team's Best Attorney Award.

2018 Winter Sports Update

The winter sports awards program was held on March 13, bringing the season to an end for the teams of archery, basketball, bowling, swimming and diving. Congratulations to all of our Panda winter athletes on a great season!



The 2017-18 season was a historic one for NDA Archery: being the first year the Pandas have been allowed to compete as a single gender team. They started at the Pendleton County Winter Warmup taking 4th place with a 3088. The next tournament brought the team up to 3196 at Gray Middle School. They scored their top state qualifying score of 3207 at Covington Catholic's Christmas Classic, coming in 2nd place. The Pandas earned 1st place at Beechwood's winter tournament with a 3190. At the Regional Tournament they shot a 3194: coming in 11th place out of 27 teams. The Pandas placed 5th at Calvary Christian with a 3199, 9th at the NDA/St. Henry state qualifier with 3203, and posted their top score of 3237 at the Northern Kentucky Athletic Conference, coming in 5th place. They rank 80th in Kentucky and are looking forward to competing in KHSAA Regionals, NASP State, and hosting Kentucky's very first All-Catholic Championship in April.

Basketball played a tough schedule this year and the Pandas ended the season falling to Holy Cross in the district finals. The team took home a third place trophy at the Franklin Holiday Jam over Christmas break and the JV team won the Region.





At the end of regular season, bowling was fourth in their division. They finished the season coming in third at the Regional tournament, just missing qualifying for state and after falling to the Region champs.



NDA Swimming and Diving wrapped up its great season on February 24 at the KHSAA State Meet. There, the team took home third place after impressive swims/dives that included Sophie Skinner's 4th State Title in the 100 Freestyle. The season highlighted the strength of the program when the team won its 20th consecutive Regional Championship. The Aqua Pandas also celebrated wins at the Northern Kentucky Athletic Conference meet and the Scott Eagle Classic.



Three Generations of Pandas Attend Archery Competition

The Archery Pandas posed with team member Jenna Wigger's grandmother (Mary Fischer Wigger '43) and mother (Kris Appelman Wigger '86) at the KH-SAA Tournament this year. It was three generations of Pandas together at the competition! Mary Wigger is still talking about the event saying it "warmed my heart to see the Panda archers acting so ladylike and supporting one another." Mary heard about her granddaughter's team since Jenna started competing two years ago but was genuinely impressed when she saw the well-organized process. The Wigger family is thankful for "another great season and maintaining the learning, competitive environment that promotes success for generations!"



Anna Marie Evans

November 1, 1931 - January 7, 2018

Anna Marie Evans '49 had a tremendous impact on the Notre Dame Academy community along with many students that she taught. Most alumnae would know Ms. Evans as Sr. Mary Charlanne. She spent the majority of her teaching career at NDA from 1952-1953 and 1959-1973, where she was very active in speech and drama. The outpouring of love and the stories shared with us has since her passing truly confirms she was a woman making a difference! Below are excerpts from a reflection written by one of Sr. Mary Charlanne's former students and friends.



It is no exaggeration to say that she single-handedly changed the entire direction of my young self and my future...

It was she who first called on this terribly backward and shy young girl in English class. Sister was trying to recruit in her freshman classes for a speech tournament for junior high students. After explaining all of the various events, she boldly stated, "If no one volunteers, I will have to draft people...Are there any questions?" I actually raised my hand—my first time ever doing so up to that point. Oh, I never spoke in class unless the nuns called on me. She looked surprised and said, "Yes, Pat?" (I did not even have the courage let the nuns know that this "Patricia" went by "Patty" and not by "Pat" when they first called my name from their class rosters.) I then timidly whispered, "Sister, if we get drafted and do not want to go, can we burn our draft cards?" Keep in mind: this was in the fall of 1967, the height of the Vietnam War protests. She stood there shocked—oh, not at what I had said, but that I said anything at all. She soon burst out in her hearty laughter, repeated my words for the entire class to hear, who also laughed out loud. She told me years later, "I did not know that you could even speak, let alone have a sense of humor." That very moment marked my turning point. Sister recruited me for the humorous interpretation competition for the National Forensic League team, which led to dramatic interpretation, and eventually to our founding of NDA's chapter of the International Thespian Society. (Its existence today at NDA gives me such quiet joy and satisfaction.) None of this would have happened without Sister Mary Charlanne.

She was my second mother—and more...

She was my gateway to a wider world beyond the comforts of home. At times I think I saw her more than I did my own mother, and spent more time in her classroom after school than I did in my own bedroom. The hours of driving across the state to speech tournaments were great and joyful adventures, with her and with other marvelous women on this team.

And in so many ways, my adult life echoed hers and built on the seeds she planted in my soul...


I taught high school English and Theater, yet left that for a few years to become the professional actor she hoped I would be, but then returned to teaching at an art high school to support my acting. There I found that I could also guide high schoolers onto college and became a school counselor, encouraging others to take their flights like she did for me. Last December, I took my two children and their significant others to meet her at home at St. Charles, a visit we will long hold in our hearts. My daughter, Kelly Anna—yes, named after her—knowing that she would not have been born without my move to Chicago, asked, "What made you send my mother to Northwestern?" Anna Marie replied, "I just saw something special in her." May we all find that person in our lives and never let them down.

Anna Marie Evans, you were one grand woman! I will miss you, but you will never be far from my mind or my prayers. May the memories of the righteous be a blessing. Amen.






