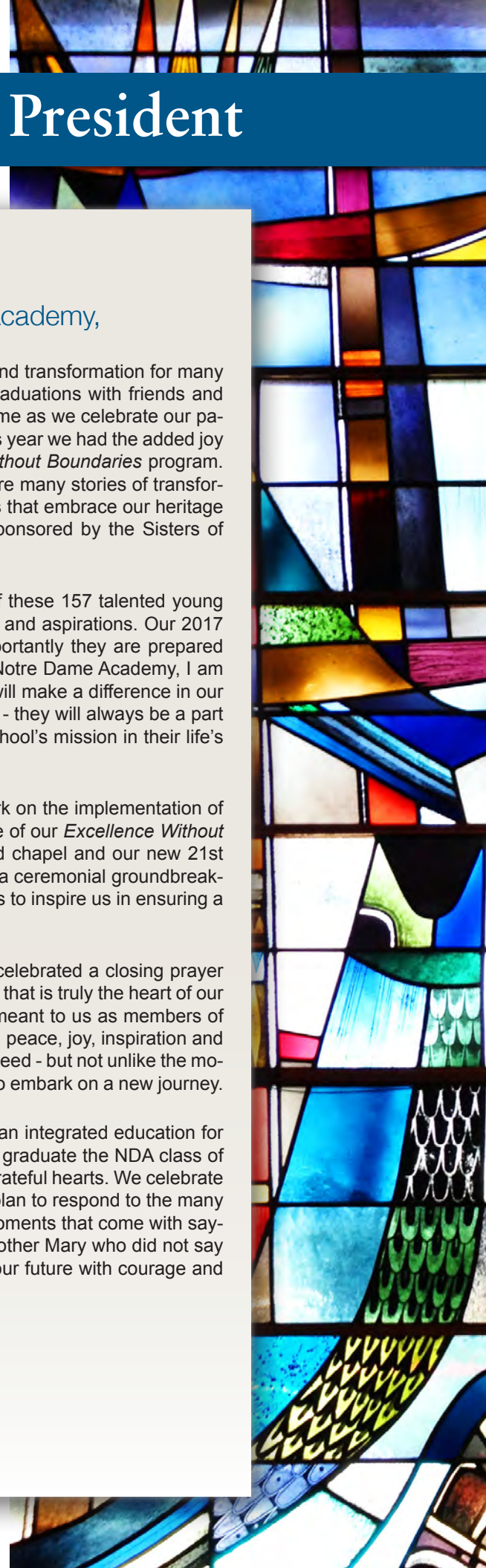

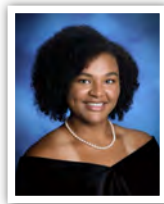
# THE NOTRE DAME ACADEMY TRADITION

On Friday, May 5, members of the Notre Dame Academy community gathered along with several invited guests to crown the Blessed Mother as their queen and petition her blessing on the school's *Excellence Without Boundaries - Empowering 21st Century Women* groundbreaking. While heavy spring storms prevented the May Crowning and groundbreaking ceremonies from being held outside as originally planned, no amount of rain could dampen the spirit of the occasion.

May Crowning has always been a very memorable annual event at Notre Dame Academy. Students, faculty, staff and administration come together each year to honor the school's patroness and reflect on Notre Dame Academy's educational mission as a school dedicated to Mary. This year NDA was honored to have Bishop Roger Foys preside at the ceremony.

As is the tradition at Notre Dame Academy, the privilege of crowning Mary went to a senior. All seniors are invited to submit a reflection about the Blessed Mother and how they have viewed her as a role model. This year Katie Schawe was selected to crown Mary and Lauren Reinersman was chosen to carry Mary's crown. Liz Urban, Abby Kelly, Georgia Laird, Stephanie Meyer, Madison McCauley, Elizabeth Connerhan, Claire Connerhan, Sophie Middendorf, Sally Bishop and Ruthie Brown made up the May Crowning honor guard.



Following the May Crowning, Notre Dame Academy marked the official groundbreaking of the *Excellence Without Boundaries* program. NDA alumna Lisa Cooney Henderson '82 emceed the event and began by welcoming several special guests. Along with the campaign leadership team and NDA Board of Directors, those invited were Most Reverend Roger J. Foys, D.D., Bishop of Covington, Mr. Michael Clines, Superintendent of Schools at the Diocese of Covington, Sister Mary Ethel Parrot, SND, Provincial Sisters of Notre Dame Covington, Father Ryan Stenger, NDA Chaplain Father Michael Hennigan, NDA Board Chair Robert Hoffer, and Campaign Chairs Dr. Tony and Gerry Zembrodt and Gary and Gina Wulfeck.

"This is an exciting day in the history of Notre Dame Academy," Lisa said in her opening remarks. "Today we gather to celebrate and bless the expansion of the NDA campus and ask for blessings upon those involved in making this dream a reality." She added, "The future is bright for the mission of Notre Dame Academy and for all the future young women who will learn and grow in these wonderful new facilities."

NDA President Dr. Laura Koehl addressed the crowd saying, "Today, we officially announce the groundbreaking of this comprehensive project to secure the future of NDA. Since the founding of our school in 1906 by the Sisters of Notre Dame, we have continued to respond to the challenges and opportunities of the times."

For years, Notre Dame Academy has led the way in educational technology, integrating core competencies that enable students to thrive in the 21st century. As the only all-female college preparatory school in Northern Kentucky, Notre Dame Academy has demonstrated a strong commitment to academic excellence and empowering students by giving them immediate access to cutting-edge technology. At NDA, educators believe that fundamental skills such as collaboration, communication, creativity and critical thinking are required for success in today's global community.

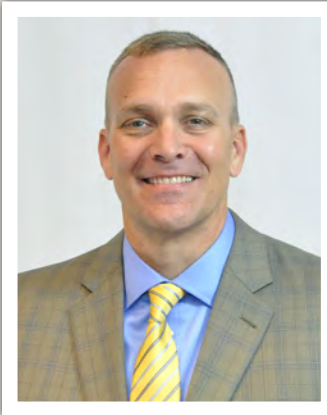

## CLASS OF 2017 HONORED AT ACADEMIC SIGNING

On Wednesday, May 3, Notre Dame Academy held an Academic Signing in honor of the Class of 2017 for their outstanding academic achievements. NDA's Class of 2017 earned over \$15.1 million in scholarship offers. A total of 53 seniors (34% of the class) received at least half the cost of tuition through scholarships and grants at the institutions they plan to attend. This is a true testimony to the education and preparation young women receive at NDA.

## PANDAS SELECTED FOR KY GOVERNOR'S SCHOOL SUMMER PROGRAMS



An overwhelming number of Notre Dame Academy students were selected this year to participate in the Kentucky Governor's Schools Programs. A total of fourteen NDA students have been accepted to these select summer programs and seven NDA students were chosen as alternates.

In April, the Kentucky Governor's Scholars Program (GSP) announced that three Notre Dame Academy students have been named Governor's Scholars for 2017. Juniors Jessica Beirl, Emma Hatter and Lauren Judy have all been selected to participate in this summer residential program for outstanding high school students in Kentucky. Olivia Bosch, Rachel Massie and Bridget Wall have all been selected as GSP alternates.

The Kentucky Center Governor's School for the Arts (GSA) announced that nine students from Notre Dame Academy have been accepted into the 2017 GSA program. Theresa Berling, Riley Best, Claudia Hillmann, Sarah Rolfsen, Anna Burns, Lindsey Foust, Caroline Lucas, Rachel Darpel and Ellie O'Hara have been selected to participate in this summer program of creativity and learning. Carena Bholá, Sara Mathew, Maddie Mariani and Samantha Wichmann have all been selected as alternates.

Two students from Notre Dame Academy have been accepted into the 2017 Governor's School for Entrepreneurs (GSE). Livia Ganshirt and Ming Wai Wong Burgess have been selected to participate in this three-week summer residential program for aspiring entrepreneurs.
