TALENT SHOW REGISTRATIONS DUE THIS FRIDAY!



PANDA TALENT "TAPPED"

Congratulations to juniors Maddie Prospero and Laney Ratterman on being accepted into the TAP MD program! The Tap MD program began in 2011 under the umbrella of the Greater Cincinnati Health Council which has now merged with The Health Collaborative. The mission of Tap MD is to seek and find "untapped" talented high school students to increase the number of future Tristate urban and rural physicians. Students commit to the program for one year, attending monthly experiences at a variety of health and healthcare delivery sites throughout the Tristate area. They are expected and encouraged to attend each month due to the unique nature of every experience, with the understanding that academics and pre-planned commitments should take priority. At each monthly event, they are able to talk with professionals in their field(s) of interest, ask questions, handle equipment and instruments relevant to the job, and even view certain medical procedures as appropriate.
