TECHNOLOGY UPDATE

This week in the SWAT Tech Course, we sent 8 first generation iPads to our sister school in Uganda. As mentioned in an earlier PPW, senior Kelsey Michaels prepared these iPads specifically for an environment that would not need network connection to access apps and books. She preloaded educational Apps that do not require internet access and free versions of copyright free classic novels into iBooks for students to read.

As soon as our funds are collected, we will supply NDA Uganda with a solar charger for each iPad, as the school's main source of energy is from a generator and the sun.

Absences (p. 14)

Our absence policy allows a student to miss up to 20 class periods for a full credit course and up to 10 class periods for a half credit course before credit is lost due to missed class time. If a student exceeds the allotted number of days, she will lose credit in that course. This will

be recorded on the report card and transcript as a Withdraw Passing (WP), unless she is failing the course, which will result in a Withdraw Failing (WF).

Late Arrival (p. 15)

The first bell rings at 7:55 AM, and students are expected to be in their first class by 8:00 AM, ready to begin instruction. If a student is not in class at 8:00 AM, she reports to the school office for an admission slip. Students who are tardy to school will receive a tardy violation and be charged with missed time for that class. Tardies are noted on the report card. Students tardy to any class, including homeroom and study halls, will be issued a Tardy Slip by the teacher or study hall moderator. For every three tardies accumulated, a detention will be issued.
