

In order to be eligible for Financial Assistance and the NDA Work/Study Program one must follow a 2-step process:

- 1. The family must apply online for the FACTS Grant & Aid Assessment by **April 1, 2015**. The application cost is \$30 per family and can be paid online after completing the application.
- Families who are eligible for FACTS money must also apply for a school job by April 15, 2015. A job application
 form can be downloaded from NDA's website or a copy can be found at the school office. Jobs are assigned
 during the summer and families will be notified about their acceptance in the program toward the end of the
 vacation period.

SEFNK, now in its 20th year, was held Sunday, March 1, at Northern Kentucky University. In addition to NDA students winning the school award for most points amassed, Notre Dame students took home the two top awards at the fair. NDA senior Cassidy Ryan took home the prize for First Place Overall and junior Kelsey Sucher was awarded Second Place Overall. Cassidy now receives an all-expenses-paid trip to compete in the International Science and Engineering Fair to be held in Pittsburgh in mid-May. Kelsey is the alternate to the International Science and Engineering Fair.

SUPPORT TAX CREDIT FOR TUITION ASSISTANCE

Representatives Tommy Thompson (D) and David Floyd (R) have recently filed House Bill 384. The bill helps parents exercise their right to choose the educational environment most appropriate for their children. It would accomplish this goal by increasing the amount of tuition assistance available to children enrolled in nonpublic schools, including Catholic schools. National Eating Disorders Awareness Week

The theme of the 2015 National Eating Disorders Awareness Week (February 22-28), "I Had No Idea", focused on the importance of early intervention. Early detection of eating disorders and



intervention improves the likelihood of full recovery. Too often symptoms are overlooked as insignificant behaviors when in fact many of these are early warning signs of eating disorders. The Counseling Staff at NDA supported this increased awareness of eating disorders and offered resources for our students through posters, announcements, and emails.
