Blessings friends,

As we journey together through this holy season of Lent, we remember the importance of our identity as a Catholic high school. Our students have many opportunities not only during the Lenten season, but throughout the year, to grow in their faith at NDA. Forming the young women of Notre Dame Academy to be servant leaders is an integral part their experience here. Teaching them the importance of putting their faith into action and their responsibility to develop their God-given gifts and to share those gifts with others are key components of an NDA education.

Faith formation is not limited to our Religion classes at NDA, it can be seen in every subject area and each classroom throughout the day. We pray at the beginning and end of each day. We pray a decade of the rosary daily before school in our chapel. We celebrate the Eucharist together regularly and our community is offered the opportunity for the sacrament of reconciliation frequently. Our students participate in retreats that further develop their relationship with God. Our Chaplain, Fr. Hennigan, and our Campus Minister, Bridget Price, work with our peer ministers to ensure that our students are sharing their faith with each other in positive and productive ways.

These fundamental elements of our Catholic identity at NDA help to form our students into women who will use their faith to make incredible differences in our world someday!

The day will include a Career Fair, breakout sessions featuring many different career topics and a special presentation by NDA alumna Lt. Col. Amy McGrath Henderson' 93. 
AND THE VERDICT IS...

Being a sophomore has been a great experience where she has found her place with an "amazing friend group". She is also excited to get her class ring soon!



IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR JUNIOR & SENIOR PARENTS & STUDENTS

Here are a few reminders as our Juniors and Seniors prepare for this year's Prom:

- Prom is scheduled for Friday, March 24 from 8:00 p.m. to 12:00 midnight at the Hilton Netherland Hotel downtown Cincinnati. School will dismiss at 11:30 a.m. on this day, and anyone attending Prom must be in attendance for the day's duration.
- Prom is a drug and alcohol-free event, and random breathalyzers will be administered as students arrive at the Prom.
- Any student or guest whose dress, dancing or behavior is deemed inappropriate by the prom coordinators will be sent home
 after their parents have been notified. Dresses must be the appropriate length (extending below the student's fingertips when
 held straight at her side), cover the front and back areas appropriately and avoid cutouts where the midriff or usually covered
 areas are exposed. * PLEASE NOTE: These same dress code expectations also apply to Covington Catholic's Prom.
- Students should arrive to the Hilton no later than 8:20 p.m. or admittance to the Prom will not be granted, and students will be permitted to leave the Prom as early as 11:45 p.m. Anyone arriving later must provide documentation from a parent and be pre-approved by Mrs. Phillips.


