

FROM GARRY L. EDMONDSON, KENTON COUNTY ATTORNEY

Under Kentucky law, you **must be twenty-one years of age** in order to purchase or consume alcohol. **The law does not discriminate against location; it is illegal for minors (less than twenty-one years of age) to drink alcohol anywhere.** Even if an adult (including parents) approves, it remains illegal for a minor to consume alcohol.

It is a criminal offense to permit underage drinking on private or public property if the parent knew, or should have known, about the drinking. Penalties for this offense can range from \$250 fine per violation to a \$500 fine and/or 12 months in jail. My office will prosecute parents or adults who facilitate a minor's consumption of alcohol, seeking the maximum punishments the law provides.

In addition to the criminal ramifications, parents are subject to severe civil suits in case of personal injury or property damage due to minors consuming alcohol on their property.

Dear Parents,

As we release our calendar for the 2013-14 school year I am writing to address the subject of break time scheduled in the spring. I have worked with Covington Catholic Principal, Bob Rowe, in creating a school calendar consistent with our responsibilities to fulfill the academic mission of each of our schools while keeping in the mind the needs of our students and school families.

For the coming school year, Easter is not until April 20. This is very late in the school year and will leave only 4 to 5 weeks left before the end of the year. Furthermore, AP testing will begin at the beginning of May. For the coming year the Diocese has provided the following requirements:

Schools must be in session on April 14, 15 and 16.

Schools may not be in session on April 17 and 18.

As principals and on behalf of our respective faculties, it is our belief that an extended spring break would be too late in the year and may be detrimental to our academic objectives. Additionally, it is not possible to honor the Diocesan requirements and provide for another full week of spring break time without extending the school year.

Therefore, this coming school year, NDA and CCH have decided to schedule an Easter break from April 17 - 21. School will resume at both schools on April 22. In addition we will have a four-day weekend from March 21 -24. This will allow for the needed teaching time in April. Students will be finished by the end of May for both schools.

As principals of NDA and CCH we believe this calendar enables us to adhere to our commitment to the academic mission of each of our schools. We respect the need for students to have breaks from school and for families to be able to have time together during those breaks. The calendar allows for time throughout the year for significant breaks from school and time with family especially at Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter. We appreciate your support in this decision.

EARTH DAY AT NDA ◀

The Environmental Club at Notre Dame Academy oversees the school's recycling of aluminum cans and paper, and plans activities to help promote environmental awareness on campus. The eco-friendly club has had a number of successes this year.

First, they have entered their second year of single stream recycling through Rumpke. They can recycle all paper, aluminum, steel, glass, and plastic that is used at NDA. The club has made great strides in getting more materials recycled by having a dedicated group of students recycle every Friday after school.

Last spring the club launched a composting program for the Sisters of Notre Dame on the fourth floor of NDA's school building. This Earth Day they will triple NDA's composting capacity. "This will allow all vegetable waste from the fourth floor to be composted and used in Sr. Mary Ethel's garden," says club moderator, Mr. Dan Martin. "With the added capacity, we are hoping to eventually launch a composting program for the vegetable waste produced in our cafeteria," adds Martin.

In addition to all of these things, NDA's Environmental Club is partnering with the Rotary Club of Covington to help maintain and beautify the Rotary Garden at Devou Park.

Congratulations to Mr. Martin and the Environmental Club at NDA for all of their environmental efforts to make a difference in the world!



Annual Appeal


