LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL ◀

Blessings friends,

I hope you and your daughter enjoyed a wonderful Easter and spring break. Our construction crew took full advantage of the empty building and accomplished quite a bit last week. Here are a few highlights:

- The new exterior door in the Faculty Room was cut through, however, not yet functional. The windows in the wall adjoining the new Learning Center were bricked in as well.
- The interior windows in the new Library flex room/classroom were installed.
- Rooms are beginning to take shape in the Collaborative Learning Center as the studs went up for new walls.
- Workers are presently running the conduit for the new elevator in the first floor ceiling.
- The exterior wall for the chapel area has been removed and they are working on taking out the exterior walls where the new entrance to the chapel will be. You can see the new Chapel exterior taking shape including the placement of the new stained glass windows with the completion of the block wall.
- The lighting in the parking lot has switched over to the new system and with the new poles and LED lights.
- Work was completed on the heating system in the original building with installation of new air handler in the chapel and ventilators in the new spaces.

This summer, Notre Dame Academy is kicking off its **Panda Test Prep Program** with an ACT Prep Course. The course will be held Monday, June 4 through Friday, June 8 from 9:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m. each day. This ACT Prep Course is aligned with the June 9 and July 14 ACT test dates. The course will be taught by NDA faculty members and features:

- **Five 3-hour classes** - Monday, June 4 - Friday, June 8 | 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.
- **Small Class Size** - Class will be limited to 20 students

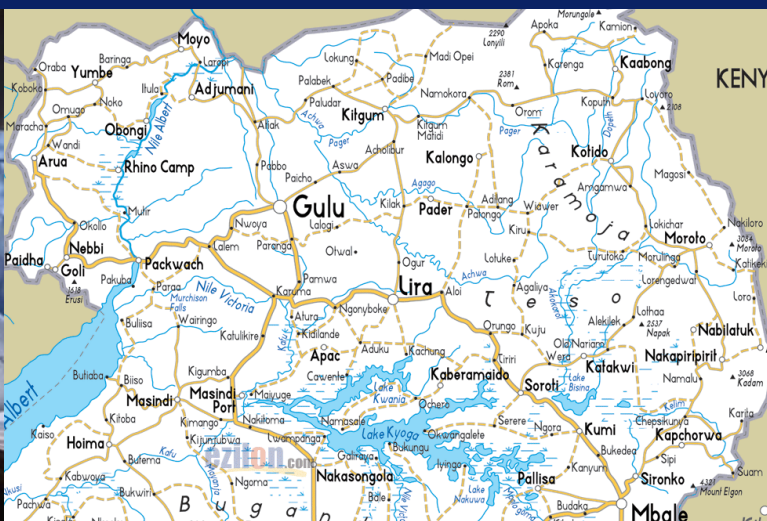
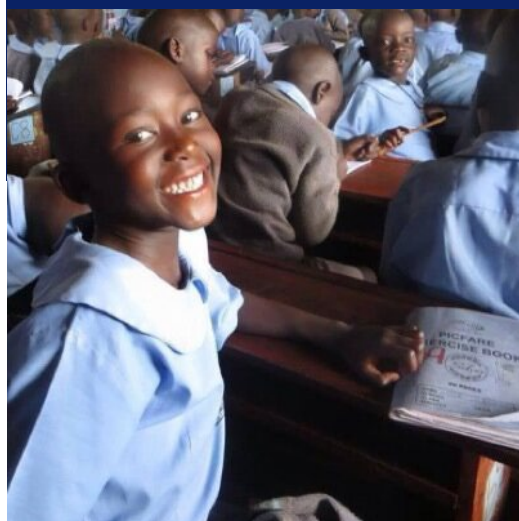

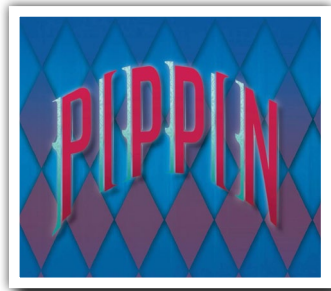
HOSTED AT NOTRE DAME ACADEMY

Completed entries turned in by the deadline will be judged internally at NDA and the top 3 will advance to the final round which is judged by the DFCA staff.
