Dear Parent or Guardian,

With summer quickly approaching, we are concerned about the potential for Shigella infections in Northern Kentucky, and we would like your help in preventing a seasonal increase of this illness.

Shigella is a germ that can be spread person-to-person through contact with the stool of an infected person and then placing hands, food or another contaminated object in the mouth. Symptoms include frequent diarrhea, nausea, vomiting, fever and abdominal cramps. Young children are at increased risk for Shigella infection. The Health Department tracks cases of Shigella, which are required to be reported by health care providers and labs.

To help prevent Shigella:

- Wash hands frequently, especially after using the bathroom. Children should be taught to wash hands for at least 20 seconds.
- Do not send sick children to school or child care.
- Clean and sanitize your home frequently, especially bathrooms and diaper changing areas. For more information on how to sanitize, go to: www.nkyhealth.org/sanitize.
- Do not go swimming if you or your child has had diarrhea within the last two weeks.
- Keep healthy children and adults away from sick family members as much as possible.
- If possible, designate one bathroom for use by the infected person only.
- A sick adult should not be preparing or handling food.

If a child tests positive for Shigella, he/she cannot attend child care or school until he/she is symptom-free and has a negative stool culture at least 48 hours after antibiotic therapy is finished.

Shigella can also be spread through pool water. Because of this, please do not to take any child with diarrhea swimming. You should wait two weeks after the diarrhea stops.





SCIENCE RESEARCH STUDENTS ◀

Several Notre Dame Academy science research students participated in the **Kentucky Junior Academy of Science Symposium** at the University of Kentucky on April 27. Szofia Komaromy-Hiller placed first in the Engineering & Physics category and third overall in all the physical science categories. Other students placed second in their categories: Kelsey Sucher in Chemistry and Earth Science, Cassie Schoborg in Engineering and Physics, and Giannina Rokvic in Environmental Science. Kelsey will be the secretary of KJAS for 2013-14.



JETS ◀

NDA's two Junior Engineering Technical Society (JETS) teams recently participated in the annual **TEAMS Competition** and scored very well. The Freshman-Sophomore Team placed first in the University of Cincinnati rankings and second in the state of Kentucky rankings in their division. The Junior-Senior JETS Team came in sixth place in the University of Cincinnati rankings in their division.

The teams meet twice a month throughout the year to practice engineering problems and study the content presented on the TEAMS Competition exam in March. The JETS TEAMS program is an annual high school competition helping students discover their potential for engineering. Using math, science and 21st century learning skills, students work together to problem-solve real, everyday world challenges. This year due to snow, the event was canceled. NDA JETS members took this exam on-site in early April.

Since the Freshman-Sophomore Team scored in the top twenty percent in the private school division, they have been invited to attend the National Competition in Orlando, Florida in June. NDA's JETS club moderator, Mrs. Diane Goldcamp, commented "This is a great accomplishment and we should be proud of the hard work, dedication, and effort these ladies have put forth to prepare for this competition."
