NDA ATHLETIC DEPARTMENT REPLACES TIME-HONORED FRUIT SALE FUNDRAISER

After 42 years, the Notre Dame Academy Athletic Department is replacing its long-established fundraiser, the annual NDA Fruit Sale. Notre Dame Academy's decision to replace the Fruit Sale was based on parent feedback over the past few years requesting a less labor-intensive and time consuming fundraiser. NDA administrators recognized the increasing demands on students and families and sought a fundraising option that was less demanding for its athletes but equally beneficial to the Atheletic Program at NDA. This fall, rather than hauling boxes of fruit to homes around the tri-state, NDA athletes will be reaching out to family and friends selling customized Notre Dame Academy coupon books.

The NDA Fruit Sale began in 1976 by Notre Dame Academy parents Bill Bieger and Al Stoeckle. In 1987 when their first daughter enrolled at NDA, Jan and Ken Schmidt started helping out with the Fruit Sale and took over the operation of the fundraiser in 1989.

Each October for the past four decades, NDA athletes have been supporting the sports they play by selling boxes of fruit. Over the years the number of boxes of fruit sold increased with the expanding athletic department and addition of new teams but one thing remained constant, the cooperation and camaraderie experienced by those involved.

"On the weekend the fruit was delivered, our athletes worked side-by-side with 200 plus parents unloading three to four semi-trailers, assembling and filling the mixed boxes of fruit, stacking the fruit and conveying orders to cars for delivery," said Jan Schmidt. "The sale has been a great example of the school's athletic community and the community at large working together as a team for all of our athletes."

"The Fruit Sale has been a very worthwhile fundraiser for NDA athletes over the years netting well over \$1.5 million dollars," said NDA President Dr. Laura Koehl. "The sale netted around \$77,000 for Notre Dame Academy's athletics at the highest point and the number of boxes of fruit sold grew to around 4,000."

Many alumnae would say that the NDA Fruit Sale is as much as tradition at their alma mater as the Panda. Over the years, the well-established fundraiser has provided countless student athletes the opportunity to follow their passion and participate in athletics at Notre Dame Academy.

"We are most grateful to all of the parents who have worked tirelessly throughout the years helping us with the annual Fruit Sale especially Jan and Ken Schmidt," said Notre Dame Academy Athletic Director Myanna Webster. "For the Schmidts, the NDA Fruit Sale has become a family tradition. Each year Jan, Ken, their children and even their grandchildren, have worked untold hours to ensure the success of the Fruit Sale and provide our athletes the chance to participate in sports at NDA," added Mrs. Webster. "We thank Jan, Ken and the entire Schmidt family for their dedication to this important fundraiser over the past thirty years."

As with many traditions, the NDA Fruit Sale has run its course and will now be replaced with the sale of customized Notre Dame Academy coupon books through Access to the City. Student athletes will receive the books in October but there will be no worries of bad weather affecting fruit crops or perishable items. The coupon books will be effective from the time of sale until the December 31 of the following year.

"Notre Dame Academy is thankful to our families and the community at large for the tremendous support they have shown the NDA Fruit Sale over the years," said Dr. Koehl. "We appreciate our benefactors and hope that they will continue to support our student athletes by embracing our new coupon book fundraiser in years to come."
