## LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT and PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Students,

We are very excited to welcome our Pandas back to campus for the 2020-21 school year beginning next week. **We are moving forward with Plan 1 of our Pandas Return to Campus Plan** with a full return to school with safety precautions in place. In light of Governor Beshear's recommendation this week to delay in-person instruction and the <u>statement provided today from the Diocese of Covington</u>, we have made a few necessary adjustments to the start of the 2020-21 school year at NDA. In order to decrease the number of students in the building the first week of school and allow students to become acclimated to our COVID-19 modifications on campus, we will begin the 2020-21 school year with a week of orientation.

It is critical that our students have time to adjust to the significant amount of new protocols and added expectations at NDA this school year. A week of orientation will afford us the opportunity to implement our COVID-19 modifications and guidelines and hopefully alleviate any anxiety our students may be experiencing about coming back to school. During orientation week, we will bring one class back to campus each day starting with our seniors. We will break the classes up into two groups and have them follow a modified schedule. Orientation sessions are designed to walk students through a typical school day. That day will include:

- Completion of NDA's COVID-19 Symptom Check form prior to arriving on campus
- Reporting to school and entering at assigned entrance
- Temperature check
- · Welcome and class meeting in NDA Theatre
- · Mini walk-through for meet and greet with teachers
- Dismissal

Students need to check their email regularly for more specific information regarding orientation week and possible changes to their schedule. All students will report to school on Monday, August 24, following our regular schedule beginning at 8:00 a.m. and dismissing at 3:01 p.m.

We know how imperative in person learning is to the health and well being of our students. We ask that you please follow all guide-lines to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 over the next several weeks in order that we are able to continue in person instruction with safety precautions in place for the 2020-21 school year. It is our combined responsibility to keep our community safe and healthy and we must all do our part - on and off campus - to make that happen. As stated in the letter from Bishop Foys and Superintendent Mr. Michael Clines earlier today, we will be monitoring the implementation of the Diocesan COVID-19 requirements. During the week of September 6, our experience to date will be evaluated and needed changes will be made at that time.

Our sponsors, the Sisters of Notre Dame, have taught us to be resilient through difficult times. We know that we also need to be flexible and adaptable this school year. As individuals, we have varied opinions on the correct protocol to follow at this point in time however, it is more important than ever that we come together as a community to do what is best for our collective group and support our Catholic schools.

It is a privilege to partner with you in your daughter's Catholic education. We are grateful for your trust in Notre Dame Academy to provide your daughter with a premiere Catholic education in the tradition of the Sisters of Notre Dame. We truly appreciate the cooperation of our entire NDA community throughout these challenging times.



## PARKING PASSES

Parking passes went on sale last Friday. All passes are being sold electronically requiring the use of a credit card for payment; passes for the year are \$25 each. All students purchasing a pass will be required to upload a picture of their valid driver's license for the school's records. Physical passes will be passed out during orientation week when students go to their homerooms.

See <u>parking lot layout</u> to choose the spot you wish to purchase. Spots will be assigned on a first come, first serve basis. See the schedule below for all pertinent grade levels. Failure to follow the assigned schedule for grades will result in loss of spot as purchased out of order. In summary and in order to purchase a pass:

- Students will need to upload a picture of their valid driver's license in the form.
- · A credit or debit card is required to purchase.
- Parking passes will be handed out the first day of school during homeroom.
- You can view the <u>parking lot diagram</u> to find the numbered spots available.

\*The form closes tomorrow at noon for all student drivers. After tomorrow, parking passes can be purchased in person, in the front office.




