ALICE Training

Notre Dame Academy has adopted the A.L.I.C.E. program, which trains individuals to respond in violent shooter situations. The A.L.I.C.E. program is one component of our school's comprehensive crisis plan. This Friday during long homeroom, all freshmen will begin their A.L.I.C.E. training and be introduced to this comprehensive lockdown procedure. During Friday's session, which is the first of many to be conducted throughout the year, the freshmen will revisit the importance of preparing for lockdown situations and learn the solutions and options available as identified by the A.L.I.C.E. program.

Attendance Policy

Notre Dame Academy recognizes that student absences are sometimes necessary. Our attendance policy allows a student to miss 18 class periods for a full credit course and 9 class periods for a half credit course before credit is lost due to missed class time. If a student exceeds the allotted number of days, she will lose credit in that course. The attendance policy is derived from NDA's mission to provide a quality education for each student. Regular class attendance will help each student benefit fully from her experience at Notre Dame Academy.

Extenuating circumstances, such as health issues, chronic illness, or surgery, may prevent a student from regularly attending class and cause her to miss more school than the policy permits. If this is the case, an "Excused Absence Form" must be completed and returned to the school office. The form is due to the office within two weeks of a student's return to school after a prolonged absence. Contact Mrs. Grayson for any questions regarding this school policy.
