


#### RED RIBBON WEEK

This week we and many other schools across the nation are celebrating Red Ribbon Week. As a parent of a teen you are the most influential person in their life. What you say - and how you listen - to your teen can help them to stay away from drug use. Some tips when talking with your teen include

- 1. Take advantage of "teachable moments." Use every day events in your life to point out things you'd like your child to know about. Point out alcohol and drug-related situations in celebrity headlines, or stories going on your own community that show the consequences of alcohol and drug use. If you and your child are at the park and see a group of kids drinking, use the moment to talk about the negative effects of alcohol. When watching TV together, ask if the shows and advertising make drug use look acceptable and routine? Or do they show its downside? How did that program make your child feel about drugs?
- 2. Share stories. Stories of people in recovery and stories of those lost to drugs and alcohol can be powerful teaching tools. Ask your teen his or her thoughts and feelings after reading the stories.
