
SPECIAL note:

We qualified for state championships in all of our fall sports have some very exciting games coming up this weekend!



Soccer semifinals are TONIGHT at 8 p.m. at Henry Clay in Lexington.

Because of the late time for this game and the fact that it is in Lexington - we will have a late start on Thursday. Therefore our Thursday schedule will follow the regular Wednesday schedule with the 9 a.m start.

The Cross Country state meet at 1:30 p.m. this Saturday at the Kentucky Horse Park in Lexington.



We also have a big volleyball game this Friday at Valley High School in Louisville against Sacred Heart in the State Tournament at 2 p.m.

We have worked with administration to get charter buses, so girls who would like to go to the game and don't have a ride will be able to get there. Students can ride the bus or girls that would like to drive themselves need to bring a signed parent note of permission. Students going to the volleyball game by bus or by car will be dismissed at 11:30 a.m.

The cost for riding the bus will be \$10, and the cost for admission to the game will be \$10 as well, totaling a cost of \$20. Students will need to pack their lunch if they are riding the bus, and can eat lunch and snacks on the bus. They will also have time to change before getting on the bus. The estimated arrival time back will be approximately 6 p.m. If you ride the bus to the game, you must ride the bus home as well! We have two buses ordered, so we encourage anyone that would like to come to take advantage of this awesome opportunity. The buses can fit up to 100 people.

Be aware that students will be responsible for homework from all classes that they miss.

Forms for both riding the bus and notes for driving will be due no later than Thursday before lunch to the office with Attn: Mrs. Monohan written on it. If you are riding the bus you should also turn in the \$10 fee at this time. You will pay for your ticket to the game at the door. The permission form is available on the website HERE.

COUNSELING AND STUDENT SERVICES

Juniors: Students interested in Applying to the Governor's Scholar Program (GSP) need to have paper copies of the application turned in to Mrs. Hildreth by 4 p.m. on Thursday Nov. 20. This is a firm deadline.



Portions of the application that are due Nov. 20th: Demographic Information (pg. 1), Student Profile (Extracurricular Activities, Service, Honors/Awards), Writing Entry, Focus Area, Student Consent Form, and Community Recommendation.

The Community Recommendation is to be completed by someone in the community who knows you well enough to provide a strong recommendation. Please let your recommender know that the form may be downloaded from our website at gsp.ky.gov. (Letters of recommendation will not be accepted.) Please give your recommender AMPLE time to complete the recommendation.

The Teacher Recommendation is not required on Nov. 20, but instead we ask you to list two teachers form core subjects that you would like to seek a recommendation from. If your application is selected to advance beyond the school level, we will help you select which teacher to ask for a recommendation.

The Academic Achievement section of the GSP application will be completed by NDA School Counselors.

To have the best possible application, take the time to thoroughly complete all parts of the application. Become very familiar with the GSP website, especially the Helpful Hints packet!
