

LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Greetings parents!

Earlier this week, students received a letter regarding the appropriate use of social media in the classroom and the NDA Acceptable Use Policy. Overall, the use of the iPad in the classes at NDA has been a very positive experience and teachers have found numerous ways to engage students, deliver content, differentiate instruction and promote effective information processing. Students are using their iPads to take notes, access and organize class material, collaborate with each other and communicate about ideas. Unfortunately, some are also using the devices to communicate via social media and access the internet for purposes not related to their classroom activities.

One of the goals of our iPad initiative is to educate our students about the responsible use of technology. Mobile devices are a reality in our lives and permeate our social interactions and gathering spaces. In and out of school everywhere, students are engaging in the use of social media. When not used appropriately, it is a distraction at the least and can be much worse when it involves inappropriate messages and photos. One of the recent apps that has become quite popular is Snapchat (please see iPad update below).

At NDA, the responsible use of social media is being addressed in three ways;

- 1. Classroom management
- 2. Security measures to block access
- Education and awareness

Good classroom management is essential to good teaching. With the introduction of the iPad to the classroom, we continue to address its impact as part of ongoing discussion and professional development.

In terms of access, we are working to block all that we can, but there are some social media apps they are designed specifically to avoid these blocks. Currently we do have Facebook and Twitter blocked. We cannot currently block Snapchat as it uses the same port as the self-service app. Therefore students are required to uninstall this app while they are on campus or engaged in school related activities. This can be done very quickly and they can reinstall it once they are out of school at your discretion.

The third approach is, by far, the most powerful. If our students are educated about the effective ways they can communicate using social media and the dangers when social media is used inappropriately, they will be empowered to make wise choices. As they move through high school and on to college and careers they will find that inappropriate use of social media can have a negative impact on college acceptance, employment and relationships. We (educators and parents alike) will never be able to block them from accessing all the options that are out there now and in the future. However, we can educate our girls on how to make wise and safe choices about the use of social media in ways that respect and protect themselves and others.

We hope you will join us in this effort by speaking with your daughters about how they are using their iPads and other forms of social media to send messages and/or images of themselves and others. Please remind them, as we have done, that once a message is sent or posted it is no longer in their control. Snapchat is really no exception to this although they may think it is. If they have not already done so, you may want to share with them any policy you have in your workplace about using social media while at work and have them research college websites about how social media can affect college applications.

On a related topic some of you are aware that Ms. Sampson's Junior English classes are taking a break from technology as part of their current unit on transcendentalism. For three days her students will "unplug" from TV, phones, iPads and computers with necessary exceptions. Ms. Sampson's project – a 21st century version of a Thoreau retreat - is meant to provide a real world experience for her students on the value of "disconnecting" so that they can be more open to the value of face-to-face communication and time for personal reflection. This project underscores the importance of seeing technology as tool - one of many that we can use to learn, communicate, create and collaborate. It should never negate the value of genuine and meaningful communication with each other.

Thank you for your attention to this lengthy message and as always I appreciate the opportunity to work with you in making a meaningful education possible for your daughter.




Sign Up

Registering is just a cheek swab and donors need to be 18 to 55 years old and in good general health. Many people have heard donating is painful, but PLEASE don't be misinformed. Donating is an outpatient procedure with a short recovery time, and stem cells are actually taken from the blood most of the time.
