# INSTRUCTIONAL TECHNOLOGY UPDATE

In the next few issues of the Panda Press we will feature *The Technol*ogy *Evolution Series, a Senior Perspective*. Written by some of our NDA seniors, this is a series of descriptions illustrating how technology has changed at Notre Dame Academy during their four years here.

#### The Technology Evolution Series, a Senior Perspective Week One: Claire Suetholz '15

Looking back from a senior perspective, I've grown over these four years as a student at NDA, I've seen my school's technology grow along with me. This is significant because we are at a time of great change in how technology is affecting education. As a student, I have learned countless useful tools to improve my understanding of information, in school and out of school. NDA's integration of technology has prepared me not only for the technology I'll be required to use in furthering my education, but in learning to deal with real world difficulties.

Mrs. Mullee started a student technology team the year before I was a freshman. She did this to promote collaboration between students and faculty. The support system spread and allowed communication barriers to disappear and validation among peers. For example, when something goes wrong with my iPad or its software, I have been conditioned to take initiative and troubleshoot the problem myself using the tools and the resources in front of me. The Help Desk has become a "think tank." If a student asks Mrs. Mullee how to solve any kind of technology issue on an iPad or computer, she responds with "Google it" or "Check the Manual", not to be dismissive, but to make us see that the answer is truly right in front of us and if we take the initiative to look for it and discuss among ourselves sometimes finding several solutions to one issue- an insight we can utilize in so many different aspects of our life.

Just as technology has shaped each student's education, the students in turn have been able to shape and personalize our learning with using technology's offerings each day. As part of the SWAT course's theoretical foundations, student input is vital to the success of NDA's "One to One Initiative" which began when I was a sophomore. We use technology to collaborate, create, and communicate, and we give our feedback on what works and what doesn't. Not only does this help us create the most personalized education, but it validates the student and her opinion and way of learning.

My freshman year was the first year the school issued student e-mails, and look where we are now? A Production Lab, Apple TVs, One to One technology, and 4 different technology based classes integrated into the schedule... We would never have gotten there without the work of the students in collaboration with the faculty, one of Mrs. Mullee's strongest convictions. The growth of technology juxtaposed with my growth as a student is no coincidence. Notre Dame Academy's continuing technological growth prepares women who can make a difference in the modern world, women who can problem solve and adjust in this always-advancing world.
