Criteria:

- Factors which are considered in the holistic evaluation of William C. Parker Scholarship applicants include test scores, grades, an essay, leadership experience, extracurricular activities, awards and recognition, community service and contribution to diversity.
- Applicants must be planning to enroll at UK's Lexington campus as first-time freshman in the fall semester of 2012. In addition, applicants must submit a high school transcript with a minimum unweighted cumulative GPA of 2.50 and a 500-word essay on how the student will contribute to diversity at UK.
- Please note that offers will only be made to students who have been admitted to UK. Thus, applicants must submit a completed UK Admission Application to the UK Office of Undergraduate Admissions.

T. W. Lewis Scholarship Program

Deadline: February 15, 2012.

Description:

- This spring, three of Kentucky's brightest high school seniors will be awarded \$2,500 scholarships to the University of Kentucky from the T. W. Lewis Foundation. These scholarship awards are based on academic achievement, demonstrated leadership potential, and financial need.
- The T. W. Lewis Foundation offers a University of Kentucky Scholarship Program, designed to assist outstanding Kentucky high school students in attending college and furthering their education.
- Scholarships are awarded on the basis of academic achievement, demonstrated leadership potential, and financial need.

Award:

• Recipients receive \$2,500 per year in financial assistance for expenses, subject to minimum academic requirements. The awards are renewable for up to 4 years, provided conditions for continuing awards are met.

Requirements:

- Open to Kentucky high school students.
- Minimum SAT score of 1800 (M+CR+W), ACT score of 28. Minimum test score requirements are based on the composite or total score from one test date. Combined scores, also known as a superscore, from two or more tests will not be considered.
- Minimum high school cumulative GPA of 3.5 (4-point scale).
- Rank in the top 10 percent of their graduating class academically.

Criteria:(Scholarship recipients will be selected on a competitive basis using a combination *of criteria*)

- o Academic performance--Class rank, GPA, SAT, or ACT scores, and course difficulty.
- Leadership potential--Extracurricular activities, athletic involvement, and/or community service.
- Financial need--Successful candidates must demonstrate an unfulfilled financial need whereby this scholarship would create an opportunity that was otherwise not available.
- Students must complete and submit a FAFSA form by February 15, 2012 to be considered.
