Students are required to attend school all day on the day of the event. Prom is school sponsored and drug and alcohol free. Random breathalyzers will be administered. The PPC plans and provides an After Prom Event at Notre Dame Academy for the students.
- **<u>Final Exams</u>** May 15,18,19 Seniors will follow a special half-day schedule each of these days in order to have an exam in each of their classes. Exemption may apply if offered and if the student qualifies.

GRADUATION EVENTS
