Greetings parents!

During this Advent Season, we find special ways to pause and reflect on our spiritual journey as a community. Each morning one of the girls reads an Advent Prayer over the PA. I have shared today's prayer with you below. Our daily Advent prayer calls to mind the true gift of the season. During Advent we are celebrating Reconciliation in all religion classes. Additionally, our Campus Ministry Office and Peer Ministry Team have arranged for the special recognition of Advent through prayers, decorations and special events in homeroom.

As you may know, NDA participated in the Uganda Shoe Project this past month. We collected over 1200 pairs of shoes. These will be turned into funding for a water purification project at our school in Uganda. Congratulations to the students who helped to lead the project and many thanks to those who made donations. Speaking of contributions, yesterday a group of 8th graders and several NDA students got together to make peanut butter and jelly sandwiches for local food pantries. Over 900 sandwiches were prepared and these have been delivered to five different agencies in our area.

Students are required to wear their uniforms for exams. This year the second quarter will end on the last day of exams. The third quarter will begin when we return from Christmas break on January 6. The book follows Kelsey across the world as he tries to find the people who made his clothes. He travels to Honduras, Bangladesh, and China meeting many interesting people along the way. I, Katie Hellmann, emailed Kelsey and asked to see if he was speaking anytime soon, and it just so happens that he was speaking at Indian Hill High School two days after I emailed him! A group of girls and I went to see him speak. Kelsey spoke about his jeans and where they were made in sweatshops. He stated how only 3% of the clothes in your closet are made in America and he asked us the question, "Exploitation or Opportunity?" This was a very



hard question to answer because one person's sweatshop is another person's opportunity. The opportunity could be the only way to feed their family.

Kelsey is also the author of "Where Am I Eating?" He does basically the same thing but follows his food across the world! Kelsey was a wonderful speaker and he taught us how to make a difference in how people are treated in sweatshops, and to always buy fair trade. When the other students and I met him (image below) he was one of the most genuine and kind people that I have ever met. I would highly recommend going to hear him speak, it will really change your perspective on the importance of that little tag in the back of your clothes.
