# EXCELLENCE WITHOUT BOUNDARIES EMPOWERING 21<sup>ST</sup> CENTURY WOMEN









Notre Dame Academy has announced the launch of a \$7 million capital campaign to renovate our 20th century building into a 21st century environment where we will continue to serve as a premier Catholic high school, providing excellent academic and co-curricular programs that prepare our graduates to be outstanding female leaders serving the world.

Thanks to a strong leadership team, the campaign is well on its way to reaching the \$7 million goal for the *Excellence Without Boundaries - Empowering 21st Century Women* capital campaign. The campaign has already raised \$5 million, over 70% of the \$7 million goal in the campaign's intial phase, a six-month period of intense internal planning and preliminary gift solicitation behind the scenes. The initial phase ended on Monday with the public announcement of the campaign which was a special ceremony honoring NDA alumna, Ruth Wehage Schroer '38, who bequeathed \$1.995 million to NDA and will support the campaign. NDA's goal is to secure the remaining 2 million over the course of the next twelve months.

In light of NDA's tradition of holistic education, the campaign will support four funding priorities: Chapel Renovation; a 21st Century Collaborative Learning Center; a new Food Court and Student Commons; and Elevator and ADA compliance.

With our Catholic identity at the heart of our Notre Dame Academy education, the chapel has long been an important space within our school building. Having a special place where students can go for quiet reflection or to pray and honor God is increasingly important in this technological age. With a focus on the spiritual formation of our students, Notre Dame Academy plans to renovate and expand our chapel so that it will hold at least one full grade level and their teachers.

The centerpiece of the Excellence Without Boundaries campaign is a 21st Century Collaborative Learning Center. For several years, Notre Dame Academy has led the way in educational technology and STEM related fields. Educators at NDA believe that fundamental skills such as collaboration, communication, creativity and critical thinking are required for success in today's global community and they have integrated core competencies that have enabled students to thrive in the 21st century. NDA's 21st Century Collaborative Learning Center will support the new and innovative ways that NDA students utilize a library to access online resources and collaborate with others to problem solve and create new ideas.

Social engagement is an important element of the Notre Dame Academy experience. The goal for NDA's new Food Court and Student Commons is to create a space that will serve as a home away from home for students. It will provide an environment that is conducive to quiet study time and accommodate small or large group events as well as the entire NDA student body for assemblies and presentations.

A second elevator in NDA's school building will provide equal access for all. Half floor areas will be renovated into classroom spaces that will be fully accessible to provide equal access.

"This is an exciting time for Notre Dame Academy," said NDA President Dr. Laura Koehl. "Through our Excellence Without Boundaries campaign, we have embraced the bold vision God has for us: equipping our students to lead the way as Catholics in this globally competitive information age. Dr. Koehl added, "This campaign powerfully supports NDA's commitment to academic excellence and mission of educating young women to make a difference in the world."

# NOTRE DAME ACADEMY Receives \$1.995 Million Bequest



Notre Dame Academy has received a \$1.995 million bequest from the estate of one of its alumna, Ruth Wehage Schroer '38. With the exception of previous gifts made to Notre Dame Academy from the Sisters of Notre Dame, this is the largest individual gift ever made to NDA. The gift will support Notre Dame Academy's *Excellence Without Boundaries - Empowering 21st Century Women* Capital Campaign and will establish the Ruth Wehage Schroer Scholarship.

Notre Dame Academy invited Ruth's surviving family members to a special ceremony Monday morning where NDA President Dr. Laura Koehl announced the news of the \$1.995 million bequest to the NDA community. "As an Notre Dame Academy alumna, Ruth Wehage Schroer clearly lived the mission of her alma mater by making a difference in the world," said NDA President Dr. Laura Koehl. She added, "Ruth's generous gift will help generations of students receive an NDA education in a 21st Century learning environment."

In line with Ruth's enthusiasm for education and libraries, her gift will support the addition of NDA's 21st Century Collaborative Learning Center. This collaborative learning space will support the new and innovative ways that NDA students utilize a library to access online resources and collaborate with others to problem solve and create new ideas.

Ruth Wehage Schroer graduated from Notre Dame Academy in Covington, Kentucky in 1938 and attended Xavier University Evening College. Ruth married Ralph Schroer in 1942 and the couple moved to Cocoa Beach in 1958 where Ruth worked as an executive secretary for NASA Kennedy Space Center aircraft operations. Ruth was a Charter Member of the Church of Our Saviour where she served as a Eucharistic Minister and past president of the Catholic Women's Club. Ruth was also a devoted volunteer and passionate supporter of the Cocoa Beach Library. She retired from NASA in 1975 and volunteered as a tax counselor for the elderly until 1996. Ruth's husband of 57 years passed away in 1999. On November 21, 2015, Ruth passed away at the age of 95.

- nametag/lanyard


Optional items that may be purchased and worn with the uniform include:





#### **CERT testing**

This year we will be using the CERT (College Equipped Readiness Testing)

for our sophomores and freshmen. This is an online standardized test that is modeled after the ACT. The students will receive grade level appropriate tests to help them prepare for the ACT. There are many things that the students can do with this test after they take it. There are online tutorials and plans that can be set up to help the student prepare for the ACT. The freshmen will be taking the CERT on 2/28/17 and the sophomores will be taking it on 11/21/16 and 2/28/17. We will be looking at the data after the test to help with curriculum and assisting the students with being ready for these types of tests.

#### **PSAT**

The sophomores and juniors will all be taking the PSAT (Preliminary SAT) on Wednesday, October 19. Here is the link for info and free practice for the test: <u>PSAT INFO</u>. The students will need to arrive at 8:00 a.m. that day in order to make sure we have enough time to take the test before lunch. After they eat lunch, we will have enrichment activities for both grade levels in the area of career and college. We will be using our new <u>Naviance</u> program to help students navigate through several career assessments and to look at the many things that they can do with Naviance.
