Parent Meetings for Scheduling and PSAT overview:

We will have the parent meetings for current freshmen, sophomores and juniors in the NDA Theatre at 6:30 p.m. on the following dates:

All juniors will be taking the ACT during the school day, on Tuesday, February 28. We will help them with registering on paper during the school day for this District Test. If a student has trouble with that fee, please let Mrs. Monohan know. All high schools in the Diocese will be taking the ACT on that day. We will ask students to arrive at 7:45 that day to get ready to start by 8 a.m. More details and reminders will follow in an email to students and parents.

Build a chair that can support 200 lbs. with 2 cardboard boxes without using glue or tape.

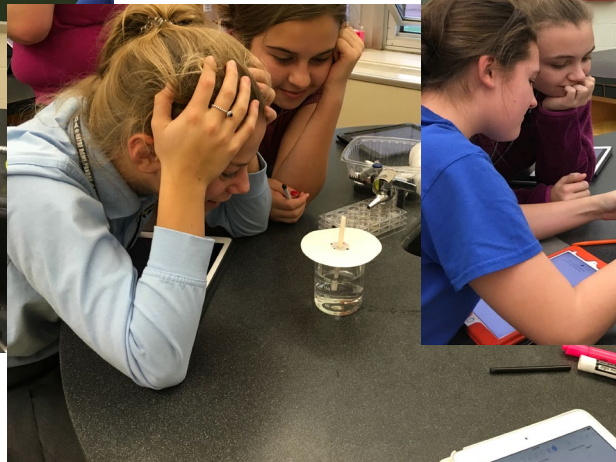
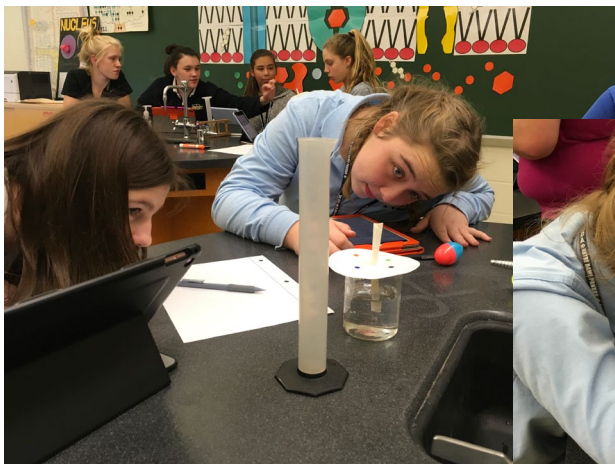

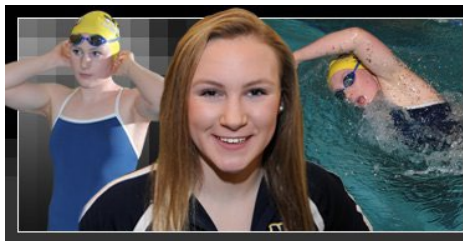
Cov Cath Christmas Classic

LaROSA'S MVP OF THE WEEK ◀

Congratulations to NDA's Amanda Smith who was named this week's LaRosa's MVP!

A four-year varsity starter and a swimming Olympic Trials qualifier in two events (100 and 200 backstroke), Amanda is coming off a junior year when she won three regional championships -- the 100 backstroke for the third time), 200 medley relay and 400 freestyle relay. She was also regional runner-up in the 200 freestyle and was Kentucky

state runner-up in the 100 backstroke both of her sophomore and junior years.

Amanda helped the Pandas win an 18th straight regional title and a third straight Kentucky state runner-up finish. She was named 1st team all-NKY, 1st team all-region and 2nd team all-state, and holds three school records. Amanda also swims for the Northern Kentucky Clippers team and is an academic honors student who is active in community service. She has another talent as well -- she sang the National Anthem to kick off the regional and state swimming tournaments. Amanda will swim collegiately at the University of Missouri.
