IMPORTANT REPORT CARD INFORMATION ◀

Second quarter report cards are scheduled to be sent home on Friday using the e-mail addresses on the Power Announcement page of PowerSchool.

This quarter only the digital report card will be sent. We would like that each family have at least one e-mail address authorized to receive e-mails from NDA. If you received the e-mails regarding the recent weather delays for NDA, your account is set correctly to receive the report card. - 1) Log into your PowerSchool account and select the Power Announcement link on the left.
- 2) Click the Expand All button at the top.
- 3) Click the Message Type checkbox for the Contact Me Using Email preference near the top of the page.
- 4) Select the checkbox(es) behind the e-mail address(es) you wish to authorize in the Contact Field preferences.
- 5) Select your Email Message Category Preference checkboxes.
- 6) Click the Save Preferences button at the bottom of the page.

A.L.I.C.E. Training

Yesterday, students completed phase 3 of their ALICE training. ALICE is an acronym that stands for Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter and Evacuate. During homeroom, students and faculty discussed the counter and evacuate components of the program. Students were reminded that if confronted by an active shooter and if no other options exist, they should be prepared to defend themselves using simple, proactive counter techniques. Likewise, students discussed the options for evacuation and learned about Notre Dame's Rally Points or their reporting location -- St. Agnes or Covington Catholic. If during evacuation, a student reports to a location other than our Rally Points, they have been instructed to call our emergency hotline (859.292.7724).

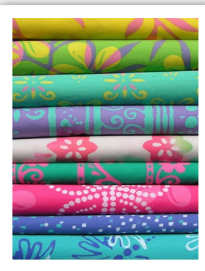
NEEDED: HELPING HANDS ◀

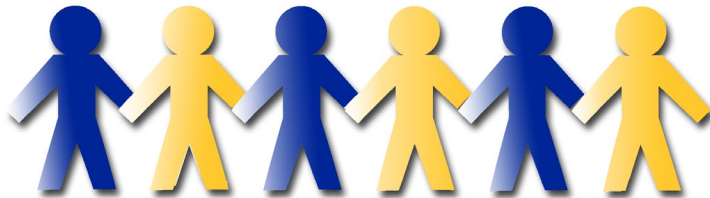
FABRIC DRIVE ◀
