
TECHNOLOGY UPDATE

Things continue be exciting for the SWAT team. We re-discovered an app called Springpad.



After we began using it for almost everything requiring a shared space, one SWAT student taking the SWAT course, Mia Shelton, reminded me that we had used this app, however fleetingly, two years ago when she was a student in my freshman technology class. We agreed that it has come a long way over the past two years, boasting a much more robust platform for student workflow.

Perhaps the most attractive quality is that of a shared notebook easily accessible from any mobile device, online from your browser, from the Chrome Web Store, and it also has a widget in your bookmarks bar allowing one to "clip" any website or article and quickly add it to the notebook of your choice. The SWAT course students are able to keep everything from recipes to classes organized. If one chooses to annotate a file in Notability or any such app that allows annotating, the file can easily be sent back to the notebook of choice in Springpad. An additional essential quality is that Springpad is a cloud-based application; in other words, your notes do not live only on your iPad, they are accessible from any computer or mobile device.

STUDENT LIFE UPDATE

Dead Serious...About Life

According to the Center of Disease Control (2009), suicide is the third leading cause of death among teenagers, and one out of every 53 high school students (1.9%) reported having made a suicide attempt that was serious enough to be treated by a doctor or nurse. Research indicates that risk factors for suicide include depressive disorders, substance abuse or dependence, self-injury or personal feelings of hopelessness, low self-esteem or even social alienation.

The statistics are alarming, and the daily pressures and issues teenagers face are enormous; however, Notre Dame Academy has invited the group Mishpachah to perform a musical about the realities of teenage life. The musical, *Dead Serious* . . . About Life will make you laugh, cry, hurt, fear and feel . . . but most of all Dead Serious will make you take a second look at life. The final message that is communicated to the audience is that suicide only creates more problems than it really solves and that there is a better way to live!



A REQUEST FROM The SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Dear Parents,

Members of the Catholic Conference of Kentucky (CCK) and the Kentucky League for Educational Alternatives (KLEA) have been reviewing the KY Transportation Budget.

The bus subsidy for Catholic/private schools has been left completely unmentioned. Though the funds are there, they are not specified as going towards a particular purpose, and right now they are in a pool of funds which has been cut 5%.

The CCK/KLEA are working diligently to gather legislators and votes. It is a high energy time for them and they need our help.

We need Catholic school parents to call their legislators and ask for money to subsidize the busing of Catholic/private school kids.

If we succeed at energizing even a small group of Catholic school parents it will have a real impact on all of our initiatives.


