

### Junior ACT in school:

This is a reminder that the juniors will betaking the ACT in school on Tuesday, February 27. Students do not register for this through ACT online. Mrs. Monohan has sent some communication to the students about the test as well. They will have the test in the morning and have a long break before enrichment activities in the afternoon. They will wear their uniform that day. They do not pay for the test as it is already included in school fees.

### Sophomore and Freshmen CERT Testing:

The sophomores and freshmen will be taking the online CERT test on Tuesday, February 27. This is a practice test for the ACT and is aligned with the ACT format and scoring. Students will have testing in the morning a long lunch and enrichment activities in the afternoon. Students need to have a charged IPad that day for the test and will wear their uniform. We do not have extended time for students that have a Plan for this test. It is only a practice test. Here is some info about the CERT.
