Students taking the SWAT Course are getting their projects ready for the <u>KySTE Conference</u> on Thursday, March 6, in Louisville. The topic of the presentation is called, "Professional Development in a 1:1 iPad Implementation Demands Student Participation."

Students will present on practical recommendations for iPad uses in an academic setting. Some examples are; assignment workflow, utilizing iTunesU, iCloud workflow with the iPad, and some recent

Notre Dame Academy students in the Accounting I class, under the direction of Mrs. Gronotte, recently completed **Be Entrepreneurial**, a program designed to inspire and prepare students to start an entrepreneurial venture by developing a business plan while still in high school. This program is sponsored by Junior Achievement, a world-wide nonprofit organization providing in-school programs that focus on three pillars of student success: work readiness, entrepreneurship, and financial literacy. Junior Achievement provides a business volunteer to guide the students through weekly sessions. Mr. Coleman Nelson, an Assurance Associate with PriceWaterhouseCoopers Public Accountants, spent several weeks visiting the classroom and guiding the students through the sessions. The students brain-stormed new business ideas by thinking about how to improve a product or how to solve a problem. They learned about marketing and understanding the customer, competitive advantages, and ethics and social responsibilities that are associated with entrepreneurship. They concluded the sessions by developing a written business plan. The students will have the opportunity to continue their work by preparing for a regional high school Entrepreneurship competition at NKU.


