Blessings friends,

This morning our faculty and staff had the opportunity to hear a wonderful presentation about what it means to be a school sponsored by the Sisters of Notre Dame by SND Provincial and former NDA faculty member Sr. Mary Ethel Parrott and former NDA President Sr. Mary Shauna Bankemper. They spoke about our founding story as well as the spirit and charism of the Sisters of Notre Dame providing us with valuable insights and context as we face the many challenges of our contemporary world in meeting the needs of our young women.

On Monday, March 12, we will have long homeroom in order to provide time to review NDA safety procedures, including the A.L.I.C.E program, with our students in our continuing efforts to ensure safety on our campus. On Wednesday, March 14 at 10:00 a.m., we will join schools in our Diocese for a prayer service honoring the victims of the recent school shooting at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High school in Parkland Florida and the impact this event has had on that school community and all students across our country.

We will have a conversation with our students about this upcoming prayer service during long homeroom this Monday where we hope to have constructive dialogue with our students regarding this crucial issue. Please know that our plans and decisions are guided by the tenets of faithful citizenship and the mission and educational principles of our sponsors, the Sisters of Notre Dame. As I told our faculty and staff members this morning, we are the bearers of hope to the students who are in front of us each day.

I ask that you take the time to have a discussion with your daughter about the measures we are taking at NDA to maintain a safe environment. I hope that you will encourage your daughter to use the information she learned in the Green Dot program to intervene in potentially harmful situations and be observant and attentive while at school and on social media. Through the active participation in our School Crisis Plan of our administration, faculty, staff, students and parents, we can ensure the safety of everyone in our community.




Financial Aid Applications:


