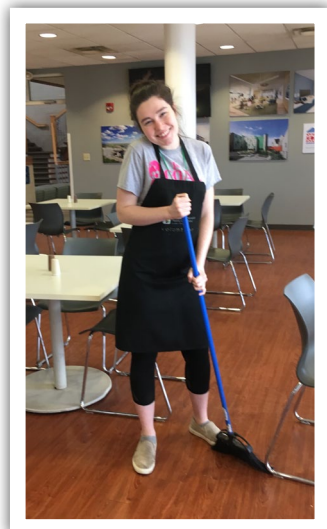
"This past weekend, I was given the opportunity to volunteer at the Ronald McDonald with the Taste of Hope. When there, the other girls and I worked on preparing a brunch for all the guests staying at the house. We cooked bacon and hash browns, cut up strawberries and melons, and made waffles and muffins. After preparing all the food, we served the guests and then ate with them."

To be honest, I was a little hesitant about this service experience because it started so early. However, I really enjoyed working at the Ronald McDonald House. It was so sweet to see the little children come through the line with a huge smile on their face simply because they saw the waffles they were going to eat for breakfast. One little girl came through the line wear-

ing Peppa Pig pajamas and laughing with her little brother. She was adorable to watch and interact with.

In addition to all the joy I received from serving the kids and their families, I also realized something important. I realized that I was so fortunate to be able to help this charity and these families out. I was not there to receive medical treatment and I was not going to be living there for the next few months. I remember this one family in particular who came down for brunch and they were all wearing matching sweatshirts and t-shirts in support of who I assume was their sister/daughter. It hit me, when serving that family, that not only did the parents have to move from their home to the Ronald McDonald House for their child, but also the siblings had to move too. Their life was changed and they had to leave their family as well as their friends. They were here with no support system.

I am so grateful for the opportunity to serve these families and to slightly alleviate their troubles through service. It was so fulfilling to be able to offer support for everyone who walked through that line even if it was only through a smile while handing them their food."

WORK STUDY AND VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES IN THE LONGSHORE DINING HALL ◀

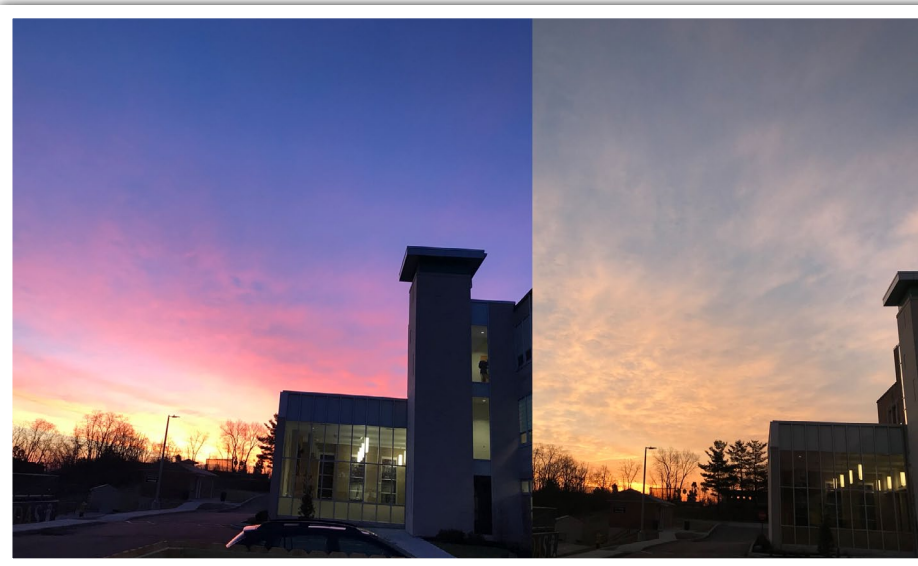

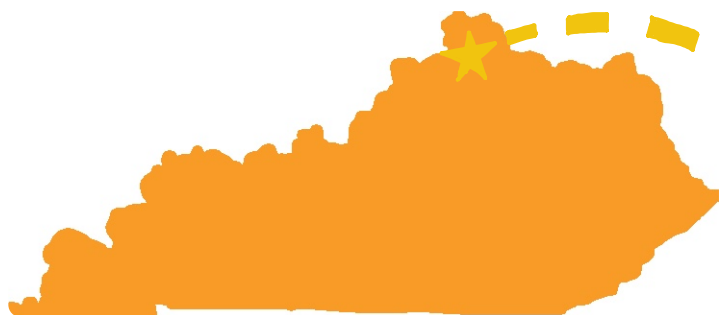
