
NDA STUDENTS DISTINGUISH THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN SCIENCE AND PSEUDOSCIENCE

Students in Ms. Proudfit's CP and Honors Biology classes recently analyzed pseudoscience materials published by anti-climate organizations for their validity using media evaluation questions that they wrote together. After learning the science behind global climate change and its cause, students created media materials in response to the pseudoscience materials and addressed their main pseudoscience claims from a scientific perspective. Students wrote children's books and blogs (links to examples below), made posters and pamphlets, and conducted social media campaigns to respond to the pseudoscientific nature of these popular claims regarding climate.

Congratulations to NDA science teacher Molly Proudfit who was recently accepted to the CDC's Science Ambassador Program, a summer program that helps science and math teachers integrate epidemiology into their courses. As a Science Ambassador, she will work with CDC scientists to create lesson plans about epidemiology that apply best practices in STEM teaching pedagogy. The lessons will be published on the CDC's website for use in classrooms nationwide. She will also have the opportunity to tour the CDC's Insectary and Emergency Operations Center, where scientists are currently researching treatments and preventative measures for malaria and Zika virus.


Congrats to our Softball Pandas who won senior on Monday against Beechwood!


Please check your daughter's cafeteria account balance as many currently have insufficient funds. You can check PayPams for your balance.
