AJC HONORS NDA SENIOR WITH HUMAN RELATIONS AWARD

For 51 years, American Jewish Committee (AJC) has honored outstanding student volunteers of all faiths who have demonstrated a passion for making our community a better place in which to live with the Simon Lazarus, Jr., Human Relations Award.

On Tuesday, May 17, 2016, at Rockdale Temple in Amberley Village, AJC celebrated the 51st anniversary of the Lazarus Awards at a ceremony in which NDA's Julia Gerwe was named a senior finalist receiving a cash prize and recognition of her volunteer accomplishments.

Julia is not just a volunteer but a leader, actively involved in several volunteer activities, and exuding passion for each one. Julia volunteers on the steering committee of a youth summer leadership conference for over 100 students each year, serves as a juvenile attorney with the Kentucky court system's intensive training program for future lawyers, and works with a summer enrichment program for latino children. PHYSICS STUDENTS DEMONSTRATE WHAT THEY'VE LEARNED

Over the course of the school year, Patrick Strickley's AP Physics students have completed quarterly projects. In the first quarter they built a bridge, in the second - a catapult, in the third - a lander (egg drop), and for the fourth quarter they were free to choose their own project. The projects simply had to illustrate or utilize a concept they covered over the course of the year. You can read below some of the interesting concepts the students chose!

Project 1: Pendulum Art. A pendulum made with a water bottle was used to drop paint as it swung, illustrating the pattern created.

Project 2: Marble Roller Coaster. This was designed to show conservation of energy, as well as centripetal force.

Project 3: A Telescope. The telescope demonstrated waves, which we had previously seen in a mechanical form, in an optical form.

Project 4: A Potato Cannon. It used force and pressure, and involved the analysis of a projectile.
