# IMPORTANT INFORMATION <

2019-2020

- As you can see from the dates above, due to the completion of our Capital Campaign renovations at NDA, our school year will begin on **Monday, August 19**.
- Semesters will be an even number of days with mid-term exams held in December.
- On Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays, we will begin our school day at 8:00 a.m. and end at 3:01 p.m. Classes on these days will last 47 minutes with 4 minutes in between for changing classes.
- We will continue our delayed start on Wednesdays with school beginning at 9:00 a.m. and ending at 3:01 p.m. Classes on these days will last 43 minutes with 4 minutes in between for changing classes.
- On Mondays and Fridays, students will have a 30-minute homeroom following their 5th period classes.
- On **Tuesdays and Thursdays**, students will have a **30-minute Panda Prime Time** following their 5th period classes.
- We will have **announcements** each day following 5th period.

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# STUDENT LIFE UPDATE

B4B1 (4 Schools, 1 Vision - Building Bridges and Breaking Barriers, Be One) is a week-long service immersion experience where students and teachers from four diverse area high schools came together to: connect experiences to justice issues, engage in transformational relationships, and

grow a commitment to solutions. At the beginning of June, NDA Pandas Ceceilagh Pitstick (11), Riley Hemmer (11), Emelia Campbell (11) and Kaitlyn Eberhart (10) joined other students and faculty from Dater High School, Gamble Montessori and Cincinnati Hills Christian Academy in taking a deeper look at the social justice issues right here in Cincinnati.

Hosted by St. Vincent De Paul and the Ozanam Center for Service Learning, the immersion program included daily elements of encounter, service, education and reflection experiences. Students participated in a poverty simulation and a community mapping exercise in Cincinnati's West End; they assisted at the Church of the Resurrection's Food Pantry in Bond Hill, faced challenges while completing a SNAP Food Challenge and visited the Greater Cincinnati Homeless Coalition, the YMCA and the Hamilton County Justice Center to name just a few of the area organizations.

#### FINAL FORMS

We are very excited to announce that Notre Dame Academy has partnered with FinalForms, an online forms and data management service. FinalForms allows you to complete and sign forms online for your daughters. The most exciting news is that FinalForms saves data from year-to-year, meaning that you will never need to enter the same information twice! FinalForms also pre-populates information wherever possible, for each of your students, saving you time.

You may review your data at any time to verify it is current. You will be required to sign your forms once per year and after any update. Once the FinalForms information is shared with all families, you must login and complete the forms prior to the start of this school year.

Final Forms is also being used by the athletic department so if you have a student-athlete at NDA please visit the <u>website for</u> <u>instructions</u> on how to sign up and upload your KHSAA physical before tryouts/first practice.

**PLEASE NOTE:** Some families with athletes have already created their FinalForms account because this was required before the fall season started. Those families who do not have a daughter playing a sport in the fall season will be notified in August as to when FinalForms will be available for them to create their FinalForms.

Dear Parents,

As you know, this past year the Notre Dame Academy Athletic Department replaced its long-established fruit sale fundraiser with a customized NDA coupon book fundraiser. Parents and student athletes found the coupon book fundraiser to be far less labor-intensive and time consuming with many offering insightful feedback.

We have taken those comments into consideration and we are happy to announce that in the 2019-2020 school year, student athletes will have 3 options from which to choose to fulfill the coupon book fundraiser requirement including the option not to sell coupon books but pay the amount raised from each book sale.

#### NDA Coupon Book Fundraiser Requirement Options:

#### Daughter #1

- Option #1 Sell 18 books
- Option #2 Pay Half-Fundraising Fee of \$140 and sell 9 books
- Option #3 Pay Full-Fundraising Fee of \$280 and sell NO books

#### Daughter #2

- Option #1 Sell 14 books
- Option #2 Pay Half-Fundraising Fee of \$110 and sell 7 books
- Option #3 Pay Full-Fundraising Fee of \$220 and sell NO books

#### **Daughter #3**

- Option #1 Sell 8 books
- Option #2 Pay Half-Fundraising Fee of \$165 and sell 4 books
- Option #3 Pay Full-Fundraising Fee of \$130 and sell NO books

You will select an option for each daughter participating in athletics by August 27, 2019 through Final Forms.

If no option is selected by August 27 2019, OR a student chooses to participate in athletics after August 27, 2019, the student will be required to choose Option #3 and pay the Full Fundraising Fee and sell NO books.

\*As a reminder, the coupon book fundraiser requirement is separate from the athletic participation fee requirement.

Thank you for encouraging your daughter to participate in NDA's athletic program. We are committed to developing student athletes and preparing them to make a positive difference in the world.

# **mCORE to Provide Cardiac Screening Opportunity** for Notre Dame Academy (KY)

## **PREVENTATIVE HEART SCREENINGS**

I would like to share information on an excellent opportunity that's been made available to our students at Notre Dame Academy. We are partnering with mCORE<sup>™</sup> — Mobile Cardiac Overview and Risk Evaluation — to screen our students for the cardiac conditions and abnormalities which may put them at risk of Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA). mCORE partners with schools, hospitals and foundations to provide convenient and dependable heart screenings.

SCA is the #1 Killer of Student Athletes Each Year, many of which could have been prevented with a simple examination like this.

The time requirement is approximately 10-12 minutes per student and each student will be receiving both an EKG and Echo screening. You may use your healthcare spending account or flex care spending account for payment.

All mCORE screenings are performed by registered cardiac sonographers and results are read by mCORE medical director and our team of pediatric cardiologists. (Please contact mCORE should financial hardship preclude you from taking part).


