

- Masks must be worn from the student's car and while in the building (unless given other instructions by school personnel).

GOVERNOR'S SCHOLARS PROGRAM (GSP)

The Kentucky Governor's Scholars Program (GSP) is a free 5-week residential program for outstanding KY students the summer after completing their **11th grade** of high school.
