POWER SCHOOL UPDATES FOR STUDENTS AND PARENTS

In an effort to provide the best possible interface for communication, NDA will periodically make small changes that will stream-line your access to Canvas and Power School. With Mid-quarter approaching, you may be logging in to Power School to check grades. If you do, keep the following updates in mind.

Students: On Monday, September 22, students will be required to use a new username for signing into Power School. Instead of the 7 digit numerical code, a student will use the first part of their NDA email address. For example, if your email address is smithj@ndapandas.org, you will enter smithj in the username box. Your password will remain the same.

Parents: Please verify your email address when you log into Power School. Make sure that the address provided is accurate. Some faculty members rely on the Power School email address for occasional correspondence.






LEARN A BAND INSTRUMENT


