POWERSCHOOL TIPS

Did you know that parents may sign up for several different types of automated reports that can automatically be emailed to you as often as yourchoose without logging into PowerSchool

Once you have logged into PowerSchool, click the [Email Notification] tab on the left side. On the Email Notifications window you may select the checkbox to send a Summary of Current Grades and Attendance, a Detail Report Showing Assignment Scores for Each Class, a Detail Report of Attendance, or School Announcements. Please do not sign up for the Balance Alert report. We do not set the amount that triggers this report. We encourage you to use your PayPams account to look at lunch balances. Select how often you want to have the reports sent to your e-mail from the drop down list and confirm you email address is listed correctly. You may add additional email addresses as destinations if you like. Apply the other checkboxes as you wish and be sure to click the [Submit] button when you are finished.

It seems that the upgrade to version 9 of PowerSchool reset checked boxes back to being unchecked. If you had been receiving reports last year and aren't any longer, please go to the Email Notifications page and reselect your options.
