

LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents,

We completed our first full week of school with all grade levels in attendance last week and it is great to see our Pandas engaged in meaningful learning together at NDA once again!

I am happy tell you that everyone has been doing a good job following our new protocols and procedures. Mrs. Grayson and I have been reviewing our new safety guidelines at grade level meetings this past week and the one item that needs to be emphasized the most is our mask policy. **PLEASE NOTE that students should be wearing a mask at all times when on campus.** Even as students walk to and from their cars each day or when waiting for an after school activity to begin, I expect them to be wearing a mask. Our theme this school year, *Uniting Humankind as Reflections of God's Love*, invites us to *Seek what is good for others and for all*. We are doing this each in every day by wearing our masks and in many other ways. 
- · Wash your hands thoroughly and often

NDA MASK POLICY UPDATE


