#### Notice to Parents/Guardians:

The Drug Free Clubs of America Chapter at Notre Dame Academy is so successful that it is being used as a template for regional high schools in Northern Kentucky! If your daughter is not already one of the 70% majority of our students enrolled in this club, please consider giving her this gift - and soon!

Loads of helpful information, program description, and Applications for Membership are available online at Parent Page: Drug Free Clubs, where you can also pay using an encrypted process. Cost to NDA students is \$25/year, due to NDA's subsidy of \$10 for each student membership. Freshman can pay for 3 years and have their Senior year membership at no cost! Applications will be accepted only through October 27.



CLEP (College-Level Examination Program) is a credit-by-examination program that allows students to earn college credit. Exams are accepted by 2,900 colleges and universities and are administered throughout the year in more that 1,800 test centers

Although CLEP is sponsored by the College Board, only colleges and universities may grant college credit toward a degree. Not all colleges have the same CLEP policies - some colleges accept credit for a few exams, while others accept credit for all of them. Students can earn credit for what they already know with gualifying scores on any of the 34 Exams Available. Many of the CLEP tests satisfy various General Education requirements at colleges, and cost \$85/test. For more information visit the CLEP Website and contact individual prospective colleges, to learn their specific CLEP policies.



#### Governor's Scholars Program (GSP)

GSP is a 5-week summer residential program for outstanding KY students after completion of their junior year of high school. Established in 1983, the program provides academic and personal growth through a strong liberal arts program balanced with a full co-curricular and residential life experience. Students must complete an application and compete with others from across the state. The Program's mission is to enhance Kentucky's next generation of civic and economic leaders. #### **Gestures Payment System**

This year we will be featuring electronic bidding for auction items. All bidding will be done through your cell phone, mobile device, or computer. You can

bid from anywhere, anytime, before the close of the auction, from your own device. You even get an update if you are outbid. If you don't have access to a Smartphone, DON'T WORRY! You can still bid on any item or make a donation via text messaging or through a Gesture Pro member at the event.

#### EARLY BIDDING FOR REGISTERED GUESTS! TO REGISTER:

**Before the event: Beginning on Monday, October 9, 2017**, and up to the night of the event, you can register your cell phone via a text prompt or computer at <u>nda17gala.gesture.com</u>. You will be asked to enter your name, cell phone number and email address. After a few moments, you will receive a text message from Gesture. Confirm your participation in the Gesture Mobile Bidding system by replying "Y" to this text. You will receive a welcome text message including a blue link to the auction site.

At the event: If you have not registered your cell phone prior to the Auction, Gesture representatives will be on hand to assist you in registering your phone and will also be available throughout the evening for assistance, or to be your "personal shopper" to bid for you, should your phone be unavailable.

\*Free WiFi will be available at Summit Hills and a Gesture representative will be on staff to assist you.

#### TO BID:

**Smartphone Users:** Click on the BLUE link in your welcome text message to visit your personal bidding page. You can search by category at the top and bottom of the screen. Select any item to view its description and place a bid. The Gesture system prepopulates the minimum bid required. If you'd like to bid higher than the minimum bid, just enter a new amount and click BID. To have the Gesture system automatically bid for you, select AUTO, enter the amount you wish to bid up to, then select BID. The system will bid incrementally up to the designated amount each time someone bids against you. If no one bids against you, the minimum bid will remain.

**Via Text:** To see the current bid on an item, reply to any message from Gesture with the item's 3-digit item number. The Gesture system will notify you of the current bid, as well as the minimum bid required. Example: 102. If you wish to place a bid on the item, reply with the 3-digit number and the amount you would like to bid. (Do not include a dollar sign.) Example: 102 300.

#### TO DONATE:

Simply click the donate button "\$" on your Smartphone and enter an amount, or reply to any message from Gesture with the word GIVE and the amount. Example: GIVE 100
