The Crucible is a 1953 play by American playwright Arthur Miller. It is a dramatized and partially fictionalized story of the Salem Witch Trials that took place in the Massachusetts Bay Colony during 1692-93. Miller wrote the play as an allegory of McCarthyism, when the U.S. government blacklisted accused communists. The play remains relevant today, providing a voice for all peoples who find themselves oppressed/accused without proof and the frightening power of mob mentality.

CERT testing

This year we will be using the [CERT \(College Equipped Readiness Testing\)](#)

for our sophomores and freshmen. This is an online standardized test that is modeled after the ACT. The students will receive grade level appropriate tests to help them prepare for the ACT. There are many things that the students can do with this test after they take it. There are online tutorials and plans that can be set up to help the student prepare for the ACT. The freshmen will be taking the CERT on 2/28/17 and the sophomores will be taking it on 11/21/16 and 2/28/17. We will be looking at the data after the test to help with curriculum and assisting the students with being ready for these types of tests.

VOLLEYBALL

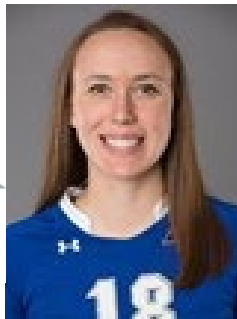
NDA Volleyball Pandas compete in district finals tomorrow against Beechwood at NDA. Go Pandas!
