Queen of the Court Volleyball Tournament - Kills for Kelly


NDA joins forces with St. Pius X in the Help Kelly Schmahl '16 Beat Cancer Fundraiser

NDA MOCK ELECTION

The mock election held on Friday, November 4 is a tradition at Notre Dame Academy. Every four years a senior class works on the mock election as a class project. This year, the US Government took on the project, assisted by the senior Economics class and members of Rho Kappa, the national social studies honor society. The overall purpose of the mock election was to make our students aware of the issues that were being addressed and advocated by each political party. Each team of students based their question responses on the actual platforms of the party they were representing, however, in order to mask the identity of the parties, their names were changed. Our mock election featured the Constitutionalist Party (Republican), the People's Party (Democratic), the Freedom Party (Libertarian) and the Hand in Hand Party (Green). For voting purposes, each homeroom was divided into sections to represent the different number of electoral votes that would actually be counted in the national election. Our mock election was won by the Hand in Hand Party.

CAN WITH THE COLONELS TO CLEAN UP HUNGER

It's that time of year again! The time of year where we clean out our pantry and get in the giving mood! It is time for our annual can good drive! There are a couple of exciting developments with this year's drive. First is that we will be working with, not against the Colonels to collect as much as we can. Second, we have expanded the drive to include hygiene products instead of just food items. These two factors have led us to rename the drive "Can With the Colonels to Clean Up Hunger."

Student Council kicked off the annual canned food drive this Monday, with a new way of collecting the cans called "Can Madness." The drive is organized by brackets such as the one used for the NCAA's March Madness. During the first three rounds, homerooms will compete against other homerooms in their grade. Homerooms are not eliminated if they lose rather they will join forces with the winning homerooms to encourage additional giving and to bring the grade into the The Final Four round, which begins November 15. The bracket ends with two grades in the "Can-pionship."

Canned food and hygiene items will be collected in the foyer each day where they will be tallied by homeroom and grade level. Please see the chart below to see how many canned goods each hygeine item counts for. Here are some much needed items: peanut butter, jelly, canned tuna, mac and cheese, mixed fruit, brown/pinto beans, Spaghettio's and canned meat.

Once the items have been tallied, students will place their products into barrels where they will be voting for a student/faculty duo that they would like to see face off in a lip sync battle. The duos include: Jay Mullaguru and Ms. Hilbert, Katie Hellmann and Mr. VonHandorf, Ellie Kathman and Ms. Johnson, and Julia James and Dr. Martin. After the entire collection ends on Monday, November 21, two duos will be scheduled to face off in a lip sync battle.




