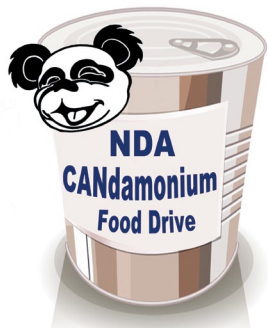

Handbook Highlight

Notes from parents requesting that students be permitted to leave school early should be brought to the school office before school, so an Office Permission Slip can be issued. It is important that the student take care of this when she arrives at school

for attendance purposes. Whatever class the student is in at the time of dismissal, she is to present the slip to the teacher at the start and may leave five minutes prior to the time stated on the slip. All students must be signed out of the building in the school office before they leave. A student can sign herself out if she is driving. If the student returns to school she must report to the school office, so she can be readmitted to classes.

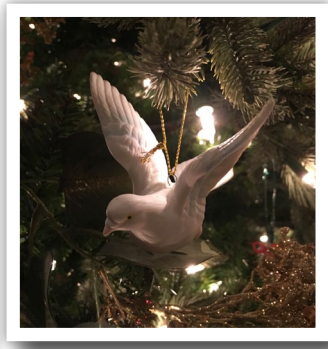
PANDAS ATTEND NCYC ◀

Test Prep Information

We are getting ACT Prep information for the upcoming February 27 ACT that is In-School. All Juniors will take this ACT and it is an official ACT that can be sent to colleges. There is also a regularly scheduled ACT coming up in the spring on Saturday, April 14.



There are many ACT/SAT Test Prep Options for students:

- Get a copy of your ACT Test Questions and Answers (this allows students to study the questions they missed on an actual ACT) (cost-friendly way to prep)

Math Prep - NKY Tutoring

If your student struggles in Math...this prep is a 4 week prep just for Math. Many students have found this helpful. One perk of NKY Tutoring is that if student signs up and attends a session of prep classes, they are able to attend any of subsequent review sessions for later tests for FREE. Sessions meet for 4 weeks, and the last week is always a big review. Students can come back and sit-in on these review sessions for future tests.

Junior College Planning:

What is the goal of College Planning? What can Juniors be doing right now to prepare for College Planning? After taking the PSAT last month, Juniors were given a presentation by Ms. Hildreth and Ms. Burgei. They updated their Resumes in Naviance, took the Strengths Explorer assessment, and heard about Junior College Planning.

The thing we challenged Juniors to do right now is to get on at least 1 college visit before 2018.

Commonwealth Honors Academy

Any junior interested in a summer opportunity? Murray State offers a competitive program called the Commonwealth Honors Academy. It can provide at least 6 credit hours and a \$2000 housing scholarship for Murray State if you decide to attend. The deadline for submitting this application is March 1, 2018 and it requires a teacher recommendation. It also requires a GPA of at least a 3.5 (weighted) and ACT of approximately 25 (or an equivalent level on PSAT or SAT). There is a minimal fee for this June 9th - June 30th program.
