NDA students and Alums from the Class of 1994 will be hosting a **Mother's Day Out** event at NDA on **Saturday, December 20**, to benefit Grace White, a local young girl suffering from cancer. Grace is the daughter of NDA alum Amy Cobble White '94 and Covington Catholic alum Scott White '93. The event will be from 1-5 p.m. and plenty of fun and games will be arranged for the children (potty trained and up) that are dropped off for the day. The cost is \$10/child and \$25/family. The students will also be wrapping presents for anyone who would like to get some of those Christmas gifts wrapped. INTERACT CLUB NEWS

In addition to our recent successful food and hygiene drives, the NDA Interact Club has several continual collections that have crossed various thresholds. The Interact Club collects and distributes Box Tops for Education for Saint Augustine's grade school and has now collected over \$700 in under 4 years. That means we have collected and distributed over 7000 Box Tops for Education! For the past 4 years, NDA Interact has sold used book covers and locker shelves to purchase polio vaccines through Rotary International's Polio Plus Program. This year NDA Interact bought \$135 worth of vaccines. Overall, NDA Interact has bought \$480 in polio vaccines

contributing to Rotary's effort that has immunized 2.5 billion people against polio. Finally, NDA Interact collects Coke Rewards points to buy supplies for NDA and for the Notre Dame Urban Education Center. This week we bought a set of markers for NDA and a dry erase board for NDUEC. 
