COUNSELING AND STUDENT SERVICES





As Dr.David Baum, Clinical Psychologist and Director of ASAP (Adolescent Substance Abuse Problems, Inc.) explained to NDA students last Thursday in his presentation, "Drugs and Alcohol, Don't Get Finessed," teens have a 4 times greater risk for developing addictions than adults. (Ask the AP Bio girls to re-explain about the development of the pre-frontal cortex.) The younger a person starts using substances, the significantly higher chance they have of developing an addiction later in life, as well as other social problems, including divorce.

More important points to make about Drug Free Clubs of America (DFCA), especially for Seniors:

- ONLY PARENTS get the results of any positive drug tests. NDA is NEVER informed of any positive drug test results.
 The reason for this is that if there IS a substance problem, it is a family problem that is best handled by the family, rather than through school disciplinary measures.
- If a student has NOT YET BEEN TESTED or signed up very recently, then THAT STUDENT IS NOT CURRENTLY IN DRUG FREE CLUB. Parents had good intentions, but did NOT sign that student up for 4 years of membership. All of NDA's 4-year DFCA members were tested last October 1st and 3rd.
- If a test is positive for a prescribed ADHD medication, parents will already know that their daughter is taking that medicine when DFCA calls them with a result, and that it for a good purpose! (It is never a problem to take a medication in the amount prescribed to you by a doctor! Legal, medical drugs help us to live better, stronger, longer lives!!)
- NDA does VOLUNTARY drug-testing through DFCA because research shows that when teens CHOOSE to remain free
 from drugs ON THEIR OWN in high school, they are MUCH more likely to continue to choose, on their own, to remain
 drug free in college!
- It looks really good on resumes and college applications to be able to state that you are a Member of Drug Free Clubs
 of America.



- The cost of DFCA's one-year membership is \$25, and includes all kinds of desirable rewards and prizes. Scholarships are available for those who need them.
- Don't you want your daughter to be included in our rewards for being drug-free? And for her to receive the same great rewards that her drug-free friends are receiving?
- Don't you desire your daughter to have the associations and to be a known member of Drug Free Club?
- Don't you want your daughter to be able to honestly say, if she would ever need to, "I can't. I might be tested."
- Drug Free Club is a form of Positive peer pressure! It helps students resist temptation to make the right choices. Teen
 brains are not fully developed yet, which can make them weak during impulsive moments. This could be the difference between them saying Yes and NO in an unexpected difficult moment.
- Experiencing drug testing is good practice for many future jobs, as more and more companies require random or compulsory drug testing.
- There are only 2 days left to sign up November 2nd is a FIRM DEADLINE.


